Dear Applicant,

Thank you for your interest in the Sexual Aggression Peer Advocate (SAPA) Program at Central Michigan University. SAPA are CMU students who are highly trained in dealing with survivors, friends, and family members of sexual aggression. This program has received national attention due to the commitment and level of training that each advocate possesses. Please read this cover letter completely before you proceed with this application. **If you decide to continue with the written application, please detach this letter and keep it for future reference. It may be downloaded at www.sapa.cmich.edu and either emailed to sapa@cmich.edu or given to a SAPA member. This application is due no later than 5:00pm on March 6, 2009.**

Because of the amount of time that is needed to train each advocate, we ask that you be able to commit at least two years to the program. You will also be required to attend mandatory Monday evening meetings. These meetings are currently held at 10:00 p.m. each Monday and run approximately one hour.

This written application is the first of three steps in the selection process. The members of the application selection committee will be the only ones with access to the information you provide and all information will be held in strictest confidence. No information you provide will be accessible to the entire SAPA organization. This committee consists of the Sexual Aggression Services Coordinator, Graduate Assistant, and up to two other SAPA members.

If your written application is accepted, you will need to be available to attend a group interview session. **The interview process will take place March 27-29th 2009**. You will be contacted with your interview time. If selected for training, you will be **required** to attend 40 hours of training at the beginning of the 2009 Fall Semester. This training will take place over two consecutive weekends and you must attend the entire training, no exceptions will be made. You will be notified of training dates at the time of your interview.

2. ***Put your completed application in an envelope and turn it into the Dean of Students office (located in the UC), Foust 150, to an advocate, or by email it to sapa@cmich.edu.***
3. You must be available to attend a group screening session as a part of the interview/ selection process. You will be contacted to set up a time for your interview, if your application has advanced to the interview phase. If selected for training, you must also attend both weekend sessions of the 40-hour training program that will take place in the fall of 2009. No exceptions will be made. The dates of the two weekends will be given to you at the time of your interview.
4. All members are required to attend weekly Monday meetings at 10:00 pm. You must be able to commit to two years with S.A.P.A.
5. Remember to detach the cover letter and keep for future reference.
