

Creative Endeavor Guidelines

If you choose to do a creative endeavor:

- 1) In addition to SRCEE, your performance must be performed, displayed, or exhibited for a general audience. For example, if you choose to choreograph 10 different dance numbers you must find dancers and a venue to showcase your project in the form of a dance recital. If you produce artwork you must find a venue to exhibit your artwork. If you produce writing you must seek publication (although publication is not required to successfully complete your project.)
- 2) You must also submit a minimum 10 page paper with your bound project. The paper should address the creative process you went through in completing your project, including a list of any works consulted/cited in completing your project.
- 3) You must provide proof of your endeavor. For example, if you wrote a musical score and then had a public recital, plan to submit copies of the sheet music, any promotional materials, plus a CD or videotape of your recital. If you are unsure “how” to submit your final project please contact the Honors Program office.
- 4) Please invite the Honors Program to any exhibits of your work.
- 5) Please be sure to mention that this is your “Honors Program Senior Project” when speaking with the media or in any promotional materials.
