Established in 2006 by Kevin BS '74, MA '76 and Elizabeth Campbell BFA '77 in honor of Kevin's parents George and Eva May Campbell, retired CMU employees. Kevin is a current member of CMU's Alumni Board and the Broadcast and Cinematic Arts Advisory Board. Income from the endowment will be used to support the purchase, rental, or repair of educational equipment for the School of Broadcast and Cinematic Arts.

Dow Corning MBA Endowed Scholarship

Waiver of Restrictive Covenant for The Center for Applied Research and Technology (CART) – Phase I (To Permit Easement to Consumers Energy for Above Ground Power Lines)

Project Description:

Request that the Board of Trustees grant a waiver to allow the construction of utility poles for conveying electricity across Phase I of CART.

The Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions for The Center for Applied Research and Technology at Central Michigan University – Phase I requires that all utility connections be underground.

To connect the existing Consumers Energy Summerton substation with the new university substation, it has been determined that the transmission lines need to run along the north and east side of the railroad tracks, from the southeast edge of CART, through Phase I, and along the tracks through the campus. Placing these lines underground would require additional expense and a shorter life span for the lines.

The restrictive covenants state that the university's Board of Trustees has the exclusive right to "waive or vary [Covenants and Restrictions] in particular respects whenever, in its opinion and sole discretion, such waiver or variance will not be detrimental to the use of The CART by other Owners or Occupants of The CART."

The university is the sole owner of land within Phase I. There are no buildings near the railroad tracks where the power line poles will be installed.

The Board also has in place a Board of Trustees Travel Policy. It was most recently amended December 4, 2003. It states that the Board Travel Policy is adapted from the policy pertaining to senior officers, and lists several reimbursement rules applicable to trustees. A copy of this policy is attached for your reference, but it is not believed that any changes are needed at this time.

Board Policy Administrative Policy Procedure Guideline

PURPOSE:

The Business Expense Policy is intended to provide information and guidance regarding university travel, entertainment and/or other reimbursable business expenses.

POLICY:

The University shall establish rules and regulations governing the reimbursement for university travel, entertainment and/or other reimbursable business expenses.

University personnel may request reimbursement or payment for expenses if they are reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in connection with the business of the university. University business should be in support of a specific program of instruction, research, public service, or more general programs of professional improvement, university advancement or university operations. Decisions regarding the use of funds will be made by the individual departments of the university within university policies.

Policies apply to all university expenses regardless of the source of funds. When expenditures are funded by a grant or contract, the use of funds will be governed by the more restrictive; grant, contract or university policies. The university has limited resources to accomplish its mission of teaching, research and service. Responsible discretion and judgment should always be used for expending university funds.

PROCEDURE:

The Vice President for Finance and Administrative Services is authorized to approve procedures and regulations for employees regarding university travel, entertainment, and reimbursable business expenses. The procedures are outlined in general terms to allow reasonable flexibility. They are not expected to cover every possible situation. Expenditures of an unusual nature should be documented when seeking reimbursement or payment. Whenever possible, such expenses or items should be discussed with Payroll and Travel Services in advance. These procedures and regulations will be contained in the Business Expense Manual issued by Payroll & Travel Services. Central Michigan University Board of Trustees Travel Policy

The Board of Trustees travel policy is adapted from the policy pertaining to senior officers and appearing in the Senior Officer Handbook. The following regulations apply to trustees traveling on university business.

- a. Air travel will be at coach rates. Upgrades will be reimbursed by individual trustees.
- b. Other reasonable travel expenses such as tips, meals, and baggage handling will be reimbursed.
- c. Mileage will be reimbursed at the current university rate. (Effective January 1, 2006, the rate is 44.5 cents/mile.)
- d. All expenses should be submitted on the standard university expense voucher for reimbursement. The completed forms, along with attached supporting documentation, should be signed and sent to the assistant to the Board of Trustees, who will forward to the chair of the finance and audit committee¹ for signature approval; vouchers for the chair of the finance and audit committee will be forwarded to the chair of the board for signature approval.

Entertainment. The university will reimburse trustees for reasonable costs of entertaining in connection with university business.

Spouse Travel. As a general rule, the cost of travel for spouses of trustees must be paid for by the trustee. The university will pay for spouse travel only when the presence of the spouse serves a bona fide university purpose as defined by the Internal Revenue Service and when the chair of the board approves such travel.*

- * Income Tax Regulations 1.162-2 ©) state: "Where a taxpayer's wife accompanies him on a business trip, expenses attributable to her travel are not deductible unless it can be adequately shown that the wife's presence on the trip has a bona fide business purpose. The wife's performance of some incidental service does not cause her expenses to qualify as deductible business expenses. The same rules apply to any other members of the taxpayer's family who accompany him on such a trip."

Clarification from at least one area business includes the following: "Where an organized agenda is established for meetings or seminars, the programs for the spouse must have a clear business purpose. When these programs appear to be more social than business the expenses are non-business. Also, the cost in relation to the time in the sessions must be appropriate."

Traffic Ordinance Amendments

Project Description:

Section 8.26 of "An Ordinance to Govern and Control Parking, Traffic and Pedestrians at Central Michigan University, Mt. Pleasant, Michigan," incorporates the campus map into the ordinance, which sets forth parking lots, the persons who may use them and the time and manner of permitted use. Each summer the Board adopts the campus map for the upcoming year. This resolution will approve the Campus Map 2006-2007.

All amendments to the traffic ordinance require Board approval. Changes in Section 8.29 of the ordinance are requested at this time. One change will establish the amount of the fine for failure to display a permit, if the fine is not paid during the seven days after the ticket is issued. The second change adds a reference to the fines for parking in handicapped spaces in order to improve clarity.

Changes in sections 12.15 delete some excess words used in describing the CMU Police Department. The addition of subsection 14.598 incorporates into the ordinance a provision that has previously been contained in a traffic control order.

Violation of the provisions contained on the map and on the reverse side of the map setting forth persons who may use such lots and time and manner of such permitted use is a violation of this ordinance.

Section 12.15 is amended to read:

12.15 The Central Michigan University Police Department shall, as soon as may be practicable, lay out and establish upon the campus certain areas to be utilized as parking lots or areas for bicycles. The Central Michigan University Police Department, pursuant to the authority hereby vested, shall establish a sufficient number of bicycle parking lots to adequately accommodate the number of bicycles duly registered and licensed under the provisions of this ordinance, and said bicycle parking lots and areas shall be established at diverse appropriate places on the campus. In the establishing of said bicycle parking lots and areas, the Central Michigan University Police Department shall consult with the president of Central Michigan University. The bicycle parking lots and areas shall be equipped with bicycle racks and locking facilities sufficient to allow bicycles to be locked securely and in such manner as to prevent damage to the bicycle.

Section 14.598 is added to the ordinance and shall read as follows:

14.598 Vehicles which have been impounded under the provisions of Sections 14.5 to 14.593 which have not been properly removed by the owner or agent of the owner within 30 consecutive calendar days of impound are deemed abandoned vehicles and may be disposed of by the CMU Police Department as abandoned vehicles under the statute in such case made and provided.

Traffic Control Orders

Project Description:

The university traffic ordinance, at Section 14.90, provides for the adoption of traffic control orders. Temporary traffic control orders to govern conditions for a period of less than 90 days may be approved by the traffic engineer. Orders exceeding 90 days require Board of Trustees approval and become a permanent part of "An Ordinance to Govern and Control Parking, Traffic and Pedestrians at Central Michigan University, Mt. Pleasant, Michigan."

The chief of police and general counsel have been conducting a complete review of permanent traffic control orders and identifying changes needed. The proposed resolution replaces all current traffic control orders and adds those necessary to address stop signs, traffic lights, speed limits, one-way traffic assignments, lane assignments, yield right-of-way signage, tow-away zones, handicapped parking, and other parking restrictions.

The resolution deletes all existing traffic control orders and adopts new orders.

The operator of any vehicle in violation of this order shall be in violation of "An Ordinance to Govern and Control Parking, Traffic and Pedestrians at Central Michigan University."

Traffic Control Order 06-3

That a stop sign shall be installed at the northeast exit from Parking Lot 1, for eastbound traffic, at the intersection of Parking Lot 1 and Douglas Street.

The operator of any vehicle in violation of this order shall be in violation of "An Ordinance to Govern and Control Parking, Traffic and Pedestrians at Central Michigan University."

Traffic Control Order 06-4

That, in Parking Lot 1, at the north end of the Parking Lot surrounding the storage building, parking shall be prohibited within 40 feet of the building except vehicles in the process of loading or unloading materials in conjunction with the building.

Any vehicle parked in violation of this order shall be in violation of "An Ordinance to Govern and Control Parking, Traffic and Pedestrians at Central Michigan University."

Traffic Control Order 06-5

That a stop sign shall be installed at the east exit from Parking Lot 1A for traffic leaving 1A and entering the Northwest Apartments west service drive.

The operator of any vehicle in violation of this order shall be in violation of "An Ordinance to Govern and Control Parking, Traffic and Pedestrians at Central Michigan University."

Traffic Control Order 06-6

That a stop sign shall be installed at the intersection of the south service drive of Northwest Apartments and the east service drive of Northwest Apartments. The stop sign shall be for east bound traffic leaving the south Northwest Apartments service drive and entering the east Northwest Apartments service drive.

The operator of any vehicle in violation of this order shall be in violation of "An Ordinance to Govern and Control Parking, Traffic and Pedestrians at Central Michigan University."

Traffic Control Order 06-7

That a stop sign shall be installed at the exit from Northwest Apartments, for southbound traffic, at the intersection of the exit and Bellows Street.

The operator of any vehicle in violation of this order shall be in violation of "An Ordinance to Govern and Control Parking, Traffic and Pedestrians at Central Michigan University."

Traffic Control Order 06-8

That a stop sign shall be installed at the east exit from Parking Lot 2, for eastbound traffic, at the intersection of Parking Lot 2 and Douglas Street.

The operator of any vehicle in violation of this order shall be in violation of "An Ordinance to Govern and Control Parking, Traffic and Pedestrians at Central Michigan University."

Traffic Control Order 06-9

That a stop sign shall be installed at the north exit from Parking Lot 3, for northbound traffic, at the intersection of Parking Lot 3 and Bellows Street.

The operator of any vehicle in violation of this order shall be in violation of "An Ordinance to Govern and Control Parking, Traffic and Pedestrians at Central Michigan University."

Traffic Control Order 06-10

That a stop sign shall be installed at the southwest exit from Parking Lot 3 for westbound traffic, at the intersection of Parking Lot 3 and Washington Street.

The operator of any vehicle parked in violation of this order shall be in violation of "An Ordinance to Govern and Control Parking, Traffic and Pedestrians at Central Michigan University."

Traffic Control Order 06-11

That, in the east subsection of Parking Lot 3, in the second row of parking west of Grawn Hall, the first five parking spaces from north to south shall be reserved as handicapped spaces.

Any vehicle parked in violation of this order shall be in violation of "An Ordinance to Govern and Control Parking, Traffic and Pedestrians at Central Michigan University."

Traffic Control Order 06-12

That, in the east subsection of Parking Lot 3, adjacent to Grawn Hall and south of the loading dock and recycling bins, the first two spaces at the north end shall be reserved for service vehicles.

Any vehicle parked in violation of this order shall be in violation of "An Ordinance to Govern and Control Parking, Traffic and Pedestrians at Central Michigan University."

Traffic Control Order 06-13

That on the southeast side of Parking Lot 3, the furthest two spaces to the south along the southwest wall of Grawn Hall, shall be reserved as handicapped spaces.

Any vehicle parked in violation of this order shall be in violation of "An Ordinance to Govern and Control Parking, Traffic and Pedestrians at Central Michigan University."

Traffic Control Order 06-14

That, at the south end of Parking Lot 3, north of Ronan Hall, in the middle of the row of parking, from east to west, two spaces shall be reserved as handicapped spaces, one shall be restricted for a designated vehicle, and one more shall be reserved as a handicapped space.

Any vehicle parked in violation of this order shall be in violation of "An Ordinance to Govern and Control Parking, Traffic and Pedestrians at Central Michigan University."
