1. The State Board of Education requires a minimum of 40 semester hours of General Education for teacher certification. Each teaching degree specifies the way in which this requirement is to be met. See also note on Group IV-B below.

2. Only one time may you take a second course with the same designator to satisfy your University Program requirement.

3. You may not take more than two courses or seven hours of CR/NC in the University Program. You need a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 in University Program courses in order to graduate. You may not take more than two courses or seven hours of CR/NC in the University Program. You need a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 in University Program courses in order to graduate. To satisfy the competency requirement, you must earn a grade of C (2.0) or better in each course.

4. In Group II: Natural Sciences each student must select at least one laboratory experience equivalent to at least one laboratory credit hour.

5. Students who participate in a study abroad program or take an advanced language course (102 or beyond) in fulfillment of their Group IV-B requirement need to take only 9 courses to fulfill their UP requirement (one in each subgroup, but no elective).

6. To satisfy the competency requirement, you must earn a grade of C (2.0) or better in each course. Competencies must be completed *before* 56 hours of course work.
