Follow these five simple steps to set your exciting summer in motion:

Step 1: Choose the length your program (2,3,4,5, or 6 weeks).

Step 2: Choose the dates of your program:

- Classes are available from the second week of May through the first week of August.
- All programs should begin on a Monday.
- Arrival date will be the Friday before classes start.



Step 3: Choose your curriculum from the following options (or make a special request):

- A. English for Academic Purposes (4, 5, or 6 week programs only)
- B. Survival English (2-6 week programs available)
- C. Business English (2-6 week programs available)
- D. TOEFL Preparation (2-6 week programs available)
- E. American Culture (2-6 week programs available)
- F. Teaching English as a Second or Foreign Language (4, 5, or 6 week programs only)

Step 4: Choose your cultural activities: (see the list of activities available on the back)

- Choose from the list of local, greater Michigan, and out-of-state activities.
- Your choice of activities will affect the final cost of the program.
- Websites are provided where possible for more information.
- Some of the activities are only available during certain months of the summer as indicated on the list.
- Activities are subject to change based on availability.
- Other activities available upon request (additional costs may apply).

Step 5: Submit your request and the following information to the ELI for a price quote:

- Include the number of expected participants (minimum 10 participants required for a program).
- Include the name and address of your organization
- Include contact person's name, phone number and email address.

- Submit your request for a special program at least four months prior to your group's intended starting date. This will ensure a well planned and executed program.
- The ELI Director will contact your organization within a few days of your submitted request to discuss your program needs.
