

The Honorable Fred M. and Lynne M. Mester Family Endowment

This endowment recognizes 1959 CMU graduate Judge Fred Mester's distinguished judicial career spanning over twenty-six years with the Oakland County Circuit Court; he is also a former prosecutor with the U.S. Attorney's Office. As a chief of the Civil Division, prior to his judicial career, Judge Mester served in the Military as a Captain in the United States Army.

This endowment also honors Lynne Mester as a 1959 CMU graduate holding a degree in Education with a major in Social Studies and minors in Biology and English.

Eligibility:

- A fulltime undergraduate student with a major or minor in English Language and Literature, Political Science, or Sociology, Anthropology and Social Work. ROTC cadets, regardless of area of study, are eligible.
- Student must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Recipient will have a history of active involvement in community service with leadership qualities, holding leadership positions at the local or state community level.
- Recipient must have financial need as determined by the Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid.
- Scholarship may be renewed for up to one year as funding permits.

Award Amount: Up to \$1,000

Application Process:

- Applicants must submit an application form, a current "Unofficial Transcript" from the Registrar's Office and two letters of recommendation. One recommendation must be from a CMU faculty member.
- Applicants must submit a one to two page essay describing educational goals, professional or career aspirations and how the scholarship would be of benefit. A description of community service activities should also be included.
- Applicants must demonstrate a financial need by filing a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov. (For additional FAFSA information, please contact the [Student Service Court](#).)

G. William Quine Scholarship

This scholarship was established in 1982 by G. William Quine, CMU alumnus of 1957. Earnings from the endowment will be awarded annually to a Michigan resident student pursuing the liberal arts curriculum without regard to financial need or academic standing.

Eligibility:

- A full time sophomore, junior, or senior pursuing a liberal arts curriculum.
- The applicants primary residence must be in Michigan.

Award Amount: Up to \$1,000

Application Process:

- Applicants must submit a one or two-page narrative describing their career plans, biographical information (size of family, hometown, etc.), hobbies or outside interests, and volunteerism history. In addition, the applicants must state why they are deserving of this scholarship and how it would impact their educational experience.

Nancy Stebbins Memorial Endowed Scholarship

Established in 2014 by friends and family of Nancy Stebbins to recognize the impact of her educational experience at Central Michigan University, and to provide for those who pursue the goal of helping others. A renewable award will be distributed once a year to a student enrolled in the College of Humanities and Social and Behavioral Sciences. Students must be studying the field of social work. This award is eligible to undergraduate students having earned junior or senior status. Recipient must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5.

Criteria:

- Students having earned junior or senior status
- Students who have elected the field of social work
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5
- Recipient must have financial need as determined by the Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid
- Scholarship may be renewed for up to one year as funding permits.

Award Amount: Up to \$3,000

Application Process:

- Applicants must submit an application form and a current “Unofficial Transcript” from the Registrar’s Office
- Applicants must submit a one or two -page narrative describing educational goals, professional or career aspirations and how the scholarship would be of benefit.
- Applicants must demonstrate a financial need by filing a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov
- A committee will review all eligible applications and determine the awards based on information obtained and, when applicable, provided by the Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid. Students will receive notification via email approximately 4 - 6 weeks after the deadline.

John E. Warriner Scholarship in Humanities & Social Sciences

The John E. Warriner Scholarship was established through an estate gift from the late Dr. John E. Warriner. Dr. Warriner was the author of *Warriner's Handbook of English* and a six volume series titled *English Grammar and Composition*. He was the son of former CMU president Eugene C. Warriner.

Eligibility:

- Undergraduate and Graduate students majoring in Anthropology, Cultural & Global Studies, Economics, English, Foreign Language, History, Journalism, Museum Studies, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, Religion, Speech, Social Work, or Sociology are eligible to apply for this scholarship.
- Applicants must have a minimum 3.25 GPA and be of junior or senior standing or be granted regular admission to graduate school for the upcoming fall semester.

Award Amount: Up to \$3,000

Application Process:

- Applicants must submit an application form, a current “Unofficial Transcript” from the Registrar’s Office and two letters of recommendation (at least one must be from a CMU faculty member).
- Applicants must submit a one or two-page narrative describing educational goals, professional or career aspirations and how the scholarship would be of benefit.
- Applicants must demonstrate a financial need by filing a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov. (For additional FAFSA information, please contact the [Student Service Court](#).)
