

Earl T. Martineau, coach of the Western State Football team, needs no introduction to football fans. During his high school days he was considered the greatest player ever representing a Minneapolis high school team. During college he played three years at the University of Minnesota where he was chosen, his senior year, on Walter Camp's All American team. Since coming to Western in 1924, Martineau has made an enviable record as a football coach. His teams are always well coached and generally feared throughout the state.

Coach Wallace C. Parker, whose football teams brought state-wide fame to Central during the years of 1921 to 1924, returned to Central as head coach in the fall in 1926. This fall the Maroon and Gold squad has won three successive victories while keeping its own goal line uncrossed. Thus "The Fighting Teachers" are repeating their achievements of previous seasons under Parker's tutelage. During the first three years of his coaching at Central, his teams suffered defeat on the gridiron but twice and outscored their opponents in those three seasons, 531 to 41.

Stewart Butler, an all-conference center and former captain of the University of Indiana varsity, came to Central this fall as line coach.

Rival Captains

George Fulgoni, captain of the Western team, is a well known figure in Michigan football. He first received recognition playing with Grand Rapids High School where he was chosen All State half-back. He is the most brilliant as well as the most consistent ground gainer on Western's team.

Summary, Important Penalties

Loss of Five Yards

1. Time taken out more than 3 times during a half at request of captain.
2. Failure of substitute to report to the official.
3. Violation of off side rule, illegal positions, etc.
4. Holding, etc., by defensive side.
5. Unreasonable delay.
6. Crawling.
7. Player out of bounds.
8. Interference with opponents before ball is put in play.
9. Running into kicker.
10. Putting ball into play other than as provided.
11. Faint to snap ball.
12. Attempts to draw opponents off side.
13. Player attempting fair catch taking more than two steps after catch.

Loss of Fifteen Yards

14. Substitute communicating with player before ball is put in play.
15. Player leaving field during one minute intermissions.
16. Interference with fair catch, etc.
17. Throwing player who has made fair catch.
18. Pushing, pulling, interlocking interference, etc.
19. Holding, etc., by side in possession of the ball.
20. Interference by side making forward pass.
21. Intentionally throwing forward pass to ground.
22. "Roughing" the kicker.
23. Piling up.
24. Hurdling.
25. Tripping, tackling out of bounds, running into opponents, etc.
26. Unsportsmanlike conduct, abusive language.
27. Side line coaching.

Loss of Twenty-five Yards

28. Team delaying start of game.
29. Team not ready to play at start of second half.
30. "Clipping."
31. Loss of Half Distance to Goal Line
31. Illegal return to game.

32. Player disqualified for striking, kneeling, kicking, etc.
33. Foul within 1-yard line.
34. Foul behind goal line.

Loss of a "Down"

35. Interference by side making forward pass—prior to fourth down.
36. Recovery of backward pass out of bounds—prior to fourth down.
37. Illegal or incomplete forward pass—prior to fourth down.
38. One forward pass in each scrimmage.
39. Forward pass striking ground—prior to fourth down.
40. Forward pass touched by two eligible players of passing side—prior to fourth down.
41. Forward pass out of bounds on the fly—prior to fourth down.

Loss of Ball

42. Ball kicked out of bounds, unless touched, etc.
43. Batting the ball.
44. Illegal use of hands or arms.
45. Interference by side making forward pass—fourth down.
46. Interference by defensive side in case of forward pass.
47. Backward pass out of bounds—on fourth down.
48. Illegal or incomplete forward pass—on fourth down.
49. If forward pass be touched by ineligible player of passer's side.
50. Forward pass out of bounds on the fly—fourth down.
51. Evasion by throwing ball to ground—fourth down.
52. Off side player touching ball.
53. Off-side player recovering kicked ball after crossing line of scrimmage.
54. Failure to advance ball to 10 yards
53. Off side player recovering kicked ball in four downs.

Disqualification

56. Striking, kneeling, kicking, etc.
57. Flagrant "roughing" of the kicker (also loss of 15 yards).
58. Flagrant unsportsmanlike conduct (also loss of 15 yards).
