



The Mid-American Athletic Conference dates back to 1946 when Dr. Earl Shoup, chairman of the athletic board at Western Reserve University, and Charles Mileham, director of athletics at the University of Cincinnati, started organizational procedures for the formation of an athletic conference. On February 24, 1946, the first organizational meeting was held in Columbus, Ohio, and five institutions became the charter members of the Mid-American Conference: Butler University, the University of Cincinnati, Ohio University, Wayne State University and Western Reserve University.

Of the charter members, only Ohio remains. In the 38-year history of the MAC, changes have led to the emergence of the MAC as one of the major athletic conferences in the country. The MAC currently consists of 10 state-supported universities in Ohio, Michigan, Illinois and Indiana. They are Ball State University, Bowling Green State University, Central Michigan University, Eastern Michigan University, Kent State University, Miami University, Northern Illinois University, Ohio University, the University of Toledo and Western Michigan University.

Cincinnati won the first MAC football championship in 1947. Miami won the first of its 12 titles the next season. With 10 outright titles and two shared championships, Miami has won more MAC titles than anyone else. Bowling Green is next with seven, followed by Toledo with six, Ohio with five, Cincinnati with four, Ball State and Central Michigan with two each, and Kent State, Northern Illinois and Western Michigan with one each.

Six different teams have won the MAC Championships in the last eight seasons. The only team to win back-to-back MAC titles since Miami in 1974-75 is Central Michigan in 1979 and 1980. Miami won the MAC title in 1977, Ball State in 1978, Toledo in 1981 and 1984, Bowling Green in 1982 and Northern Illinois in 1983.

The MAC is entering the fifth year of an agreement that annually sends its champion to the California Bowl in Fresno, California. The original five-year agreement was recently extended for two years, and negotiations are underway to lengthen the pact which matches the MAC Champion against the Pacific Coast Athletic Association (PCAA) Champion.

The MAC won two of the first three California Bowls, the one loss coming by a point on a touchdown with 11 seconds left. PCAA Champion Nevada-Las Vegas beat MAC Champion Toledo in California Bowl IV last December, but UNLV later forfeited the game due to the use of ineligible players. California Bowl V is scheduled for December 14, 1985.

Football is one of the 18 sports for which the MAC sponsors championships. The others are men's and women's cross country, women's volleyball, field hockey, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's swimming, wrestling, women's gymnastics, baseball, softball, men's and women's track, men's and women's tennis, and men's golf.

In 1984, the MAC headquarters moved from Columbus, Ohio, where they had been located for 20 years, to Toledo, the geographic center of the conference. The headquarters are located in the SeaGate area of revitalized downtown Toledo.

Commissioner Jim Lessig

Jim Lessig begins his fourth year as the league's chief executive officer. He was named commissioner in October, 1982, after serving as athletic director at the University of Kansas for a year and as athletic director at Bowling Green for four years.

Lessig, 50, is a native of Canton, Ohio, and a 1953 graduate of Canton Lincoln High School. He received his bachelor's degree in English with a minor in physical education from Bowling Green in 1957. He earned his master's degree in school administration and speech in 1967 at Bowling Green.

Lessig served his alma mater in several capacities in the '60s and '70s including assistant basketball coach, assistant athletic director, director of alumni affairs and executive director of alumni and development before being named athletic director in 1978. In 1969, he left Bowling Green to become assistant basketball coach to Bill Fitch at the University of Minnesota.

One year later, he was in on the ground floor of the NBA expansion franchise Cleveland Cavaliers as assistant coach, head scout and director of special promotions. He also served as analyst for Cavalier basketball games and Cleveland Indians baseball games.

He rejoined the Bowling Green staff in 1971 and continued his successful career at the university until he was named at Kansas in May of 1982. But with little chance to unpack, Lessig received the ultimate compliment as he was summoned back to lead the conference that he had been a part of for so many years.

Under Lessig's guidance, the conference has instituted promotional programs to increase the visibility and recognition of the MAC players and teams, and extended the contract of the California Bowl which matches the champions of the MAC and the Pacific Coast Athletic Association (PCAA) for two more years through 1987.

Lessig and his wife, Margarita, have two children, Tom, 26, and Andrea, 23.



Information Director Allan Chamberlin

Allan Chamberlin took over the duties as information director for the Mid-American Conference in September, 1983. His duties include media relations, compilation of statistics and records, feature stories, editing the MAC publications and other administrative duties.

Chamberlin, 34, is a native of Durham, New Hampshire, and is a 1973 graduate of the University of New Hampshire with a degree in non-fiction writing. As an undergraduate, Chamberlin served as a student assistant in the UNH sports information office for four years. After graduation he was hired as a full-time assistant in the SID office, a position he held for five years.

In 1979, Chamberlin was hired as the sports information director at Bowling Green State University. He remained there until taking over as the MAC Information Director. During his four years at Bowling Green, Chamberlin received several national citations for his publications including a "Best in the Nation" for his ice hockey brochure and a "Fourth in the Nation" for his California Bowl post-season football brochure.

Chamberlin is a member of the College Sports Information Directors of America, the United States Basketball Writers Association, and the Football Writers Association of America.

Chamberlin and his wife, Debbie, are the parents of three sons, Chris, 12, Jeff, 9, and Mark, 2.



Supervisor of Officials Jack McLain

Jack McLain is in his 10th year as the Mid-American Conference Supervisor of Football Officials.

A graduate of Columbus South High School, McLain was a three-year letterman in baseball and basketball at Ohio State University. After graduating from OSU in 1942, McLain was an outfielder in the St. Louis Cardinals farm system for seven years.

McLain officiated college football for 35 years, 29 of them in the MAC, before retiring from active officiating in 1975. During his years as a MAC football official, he worked the Tangerine Bowl, the Sun Bowl, the Grantland Rice Bowl and the Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl games. In addition, he was a MAC basketball official for 10 years.

He was also the supervisor of officials in the United Football League in 1961 and a head linesman in the National Football League in 1962 and 1963.

Since retiring from the Columbus Coated Fabrics Company in 1982 where he worked for 29 years, McLain has taken on the additional duties of supervisor of football and basketball officials for the Division III Ohio Athletic Conference.

Jack and his wife, Thelma, have two daughters and nine grandchildren.



Miscellaneous MAC Nuggets

MAC Teams To Play Seven Bowl Teams In 1985

Seven of the 22 teams that MAC schools will face in the non-conference portion of their 1985 schedules played in bowl games last season.

Western Michigan's two non-conference games are against the teams that played in the inaugural Cherry Bowl, Army and Michigan State. Northern Illinois will also face two bowl teams, Iowa (Freedom Bowl), and Wisconsin (Hall of Fame Bowl). Other 1984 bowl teams on MAC schedules are Oklahoma State (Gator Bowl) against Miami, Kentucky (Hall of Fame Bowl) against Bowling Green, and Purdue (Peach Bowl) against Ball State.

MAC Teams Face All But One Division I-A Conference

MAC teams will face non-conference opponents from seven of the eight other Division I-A conferences. The only conference that a MAC team will not face in 1985 is the Southwest Conference.

MAC teams play five different Big 10 teams (Iowa, Michigan State, Northwestern, Purdue and Wisconsin) this year, and one each from the PAC-10 (Arizona), SEC (Kentucky), ACC (Duke), WAC (Texas-El Paso), Big 8 (Oklahoma State) and PCAA (Pacific), plus four games against Division I-A independents (Army, Cincinnati, Syracuse and Wichita State). Twelve of these 15 games against Division I-A opponents are away. The three MAC home games are Pacific at Central Michigan, Cincinnati at Miami, and Texas-El Paso at Kent State.

A Breeding Ground For Coaches

Miami University is nationally-recognized as the Cradle of Coaches because of the number of outstanding coaches who played and/or coached at Miami. However, the Mid-American Conference as a whole has proven to be a fertile breeding ground for highly-successful coaches.

Six of the nation's 25 winningest active Division I-A head coaches have MAC roots. **Bo Schembechler** ranks fourth behind Oklahoma's Barry Switzer, Nebraska's Tom Osborne and Penn State's Joe Paterno with a winning percentage of .768 in his 22 years at Miami and Michigan. **Herb Deromedi** ranks seventh with his .760 winning percentage in seven years at Central Michigan. **Dick Crum** has a .713 winning percentage in 11 years at Miami and North Carolina to rank ninth. **Don James** ranks 16th with a winning percentage of .674 in 14 years at Kent State and Washington. **Jim Young**, a Bowling Green graduate, has a .640 winning percentage in 11 years at Purdue and Army to rank 20th. **Don Nehlen** ranks 22nd with a winning percentage of .629 at Bowling Green and West Virginia.

Seven of the 36 teams that played in the 1984 bowl games were coached by former Mid-American Conference players and/or head coaches. They are former Kent State Coach Don James of Washington (Orange Bowl), former Miami player and coach Bo Schembechler of Michigan

(Holiday Bowl), former Bowling Green player and coach Don Nehlen of West Virginia (Bluebonnet Bowl), Miami graduate Bill Arnsperger of LSU (Sugar Bowl), former Bowling Green player and coach Dave McClain of Wisconsin (Hall of Fame Bowl), Bowling Green graduate Jim Young of Army (Cherry Bowl) and Toledo Coach Dan Simrell (California Bowl).

MAC Has Three of Nation's Best Records In 1984

Twenty-one of the 105 Division I-A teams in the country had regular season records of 8-3 or better in 1984, and three of them were from the MAC: Toledo (8-2-1), Central Michigan (8-2-1) and Bowling Green (8-3-0).

The others were Brigham Young (12-0), Cal State-Fullerton (11-1), Washington (10-1), South Carolina (10-1), Florida State (9-1-1), Oklahoma (9-1-1), Nebraska (9-2), Oklahoma State (9-2), SMU (9-2), Ohio State (9-2), Boston College (9-2), LSU (8-2-1), Kentucky (8-3), USC (8-3), UCLA (8-3), Virginia Tech (8-3), Maryland (8-3) and TCU (8-3).

Winning With Defense

An outstanding defense carried the University of Toledo to its second MAC Championship in four years last fall. The Rockets held their nine MAC opponents to an average of just 9.1 points per game.

Over the last four seasons, Toledo has shutout MAC opponents five times and on 15 other occasions, held them to less than 10 points.

CMU Leads MAC At Halfway Mark Of The '80's

At the halfway mark of the decade of the 1980's, Central Michigan has the best record in the MAC. Coach Herb Deromedi's Chippewas have an aggregate record of 32-11-2 against MAC opponents for a winning percentage of .733 for the first five years of the decade. Bowling Green is second with a 30-13-1 record for a .693 winning percentage, closely followed by Toledo with a 30-14-1 mark for a .678 percentage. Miami (21-17-1), Western Michigan (23-20-2) and Northern Illinois (22-20-1) also have winning records against MAC opponents in this decade, while Ohio (22-22-1) is at the .500 mark.

Miami Joins 500 Victory Club

Miami University joined the exclusive 500-victory club last season. The Redskins are one of just 18 NCAA Division I-A schools with 500 football victories. Miami's .653 winning percentage ranks twelfth in the nation. In 96 years of football competition, the Redskins have a record of 502-258-36.

Central Michigan ranks just ahead of Miami in winning percentage with an 84-year record of 426-217-29 record for a winning percentage of .655.

Prindle Sets Two NCAA Records

Western Michigan placekicker Mike Prindle set two NCAA Division I-A all-time records last year. Against Marshall on September 29, Prindle kicked seven field goals and scored a total of 24 kicking points, breaking the previous national records of six field goals and 23 points.

Adams Joins Exclusive 4,000 Yard Club

Though he fell just 28 yards short of breaking the MAC career rushing record of Western Michigan's Jerome Persell, Central Michigan running back Curtis Adams joined the exclusive 4,000 yard rushing club last season. Adams wound up with 4,162 rushing yards for his career. He ranks 16th on the NCAA career list and is one of just 19 players in Division I-A history to total more than 4,000 rushing yards.

White Gets 1,000-50 Double

Last fall, Bowling Green's Bernard White became the third player in NCAA Division I-A history to rush for 1,000 yards and catch 50 passes in the same season. White rushed for 1,036 yards and caught 56 passes for another 400 yards in 1984. The only other players to achieve the 1,000-50 double are Stanford's Darrin Nelson and San Jose State's Gerald Willhite.

Returning MAC Players Rank Nationally

Four MAC players rank among the national statistical leaders among players returning this season.

Miami's George Swarn is the number one ranked junior (and fourth overall) among rushers, having averaged 116.5 yards per game last season. He is also ranked fifth in all-purpose yards, having averaged 146.9 yards in rushing, receiving and returning kicks.

Three Bowling Green players are among the returning statistical leaders. Brian McClure is fifth in total offense at 259.3 yards per game, Bernard White is 14th in rushing (94.2 YPG), 10th in scoring (8.2 PPG), seventh in receiving (5.1 RPG), and eighth in all-purpose yards (130.5 YPG). Stan Hunter is ninth in receiving with 4.7 catches/game.

McClure Threatening Four NCAA Career Records

Bowling Green senior quarterback Brian McClure is threatening four NCAA Division I-A career passing records. He enters the season with 7,606 career passing yards, putting him nearly 500 yards ahead of the record pace established by Doug Flutie of Boston College. McClure has an excellent shot at surpassing the mark of 10,579 established by Flutie.

McClure also has the chance to break the NCAA career records for pass completions, passing percentage and 200-yard passing games. With 674 completions in his first three years, he is a sure-bet—barring injury—to break the record of 820 held by Ben Bennett of Duke. With a career percentage of 63.8, he is within striking distance of the career mark of 65.2 held by Brigham Young's Steve Young. And, again barring injury, he seems certain to break the 200 yard game record of 29 held by Stanford's John Elway. McClure has passed for more than 200 yards in 22 games, including 20 of his last 22.

Another Strong Attendance Year

The total estimated paid attendance for 53 home dates for the MAC teams in 1984 was 900,985—the second highest in league history. The three greatest years in the MAC in attendance have been the last three: 932,741 in 1982, 900,985 last year and 854,280 in 1983.

Central Michigan set a MAC home attendance record in 1984 with a total of 145,277. Toledo (21,368), Central Michigan (20,754) and Miami (20,725) all averaged better than 20,000 for their home games.

Toledo Leads Nation, Again, In Attendance

For the third season in a row, Toledo led the nation in percentage of capacity attendance. UT's average of 21,368 for its five home games in the 18,500 seat Glass Bowl marked the sixth consecutive year that UT has averaged better than 100 percent capacity.

After ranking fifth, sixth and third nationally in percentage of capacity from 1979-81, Toledo has led the nation in 1982 (135.1%), 1983 (119.9%) and 1984 (117.3%).

Drafting MAC Players

Three Mid-American Conference football players were drafted by National Football League teams last spring. The New England Patriots selected Central Michigan safety Jim Bowman on the second round and Western Michigan offensive lineman Tom Toth on the fourth round. They were the 52nd and 102nd players chosen in the draft. The San Diego Chargers chose Central Michigan running back Curtis Adams on the eighth round.

Variety Of Offerings On 1985 MAC Football Menu

The 1985 Mid-American Conference football menu has a wide variety of items that should please the palate of any college football connoisseur.

Among the items offered this fall for the MAC football fan are several explosive offensive players, tenacious defenders, and long-range kickers. The league also offers three new coaches, an assortment of offensive schemes, improvement from the second division teams, non-conference schedules that feature seven of the other eight Division I-A conferences, and—as always—balance.

Offense: Nine of the 10 MAC teams have a veteran quarterback returning, headed by Bowling Green's **Brian McClure**. The MAC Offensive Player of the Year as both a sophomore and junior, McClure has completed 64 percent of his passes for 7,606 yards, putting him almost 500 yards ahead of Doug Flutie's NCAA career record pace. Central Michigan's **Ron Fillmore** is another outstanding quarterback. A gifted passer and runner, he is trying to come back from major knee surgery.

Among the returning running backs are Miami's **George Swarn** who ranked sixth in the nation with 1,282 yards rushing last year; Northern Illinois' **Darryl Richardson** who ranked 11th in the nation in rushing in 1983 with 1,204 yards; Bowling Green's **Bernard White** who last fall became just the third player in the NCAA division I-A history to rush for more than 1,000 yards and catch more than 50 passes in one season; and Kent State's **Derrick Nix** who totaled 1,279 all-purpose yards in 1984.

First team All-MAC wide receivers **John DeBoer** of Central Michigan and **Stan Hunter** of Bowling Green also return. DeBoer earned third team All-America and first team Academic All-America honors in 1984 when he caught 49 passes for 831 yards and nine touchdowns. Hunter should shatter the MAC career receiving records this fall after totaling 115 receptions for 1,851 yards and 14 touchdowns the last two seasons.

Defense: Defending Champion Toledo returns eight starters from its defensive unit that ranked fourth nationally in scoring defense, fifth in total defense and ninth in rushing defense. The Rockets' defensive leaders are active linebacker **Tim Inglis** and first team All-MAC tackle **Brent Williams**.

Western Michigan senior linebacker **John Offerdahl** will break the MAC career tackle record early this fall. A third team All-America (AP) selection last year, Offerdahl has led the MAC in tackles each of the past two seasons and has career totals of 525 tackles, five interceptions, 18 deflections and 13 forced fumbles.

Northern Illinois' slip from the 1983 MAC title to also-ran status last year does not reflect the caliber of play from the Huskies' defense. In particular, tackle **Scott Kellar** and nose tackle **Doug Bartlett** are two of the best defensive linemen in the midwest.

Among the other top defenders in the MAC this year are Central Michigan's outside linebacking duo of **Kevin Egnatuk** and **Steve Sklenar**, free safeties **Steve Fitzhugh** of Miami and **Tony Fields** of Eastern Michigan, linebackers **Troy Dawson** of Bowling Green, **Brad Saar** of Ball State

and **Brian Mays** of Ohio, and Kent State tackle **Lee Bullington**.

Kickers: Two of the MAC's top three placekickers from last season return this year. Eastern Michigan's **Mario Ferretti** made 11 of 15 field goal attempts in 1984 to earn second team All-MAC honors, and **Gary Gussman** kicked a Miami record 15 field goals as a freshman last fall.

New Coaches: With the addition of three new head coaches this fall, only two MAC coaches (Bowling Green's Denny Stolz and Central Michigan's Herb Deromedi) have more than three years tenure in their current jobs.

The three new head coaches are Ball State's **Paul Schudel**, an assistant to Bo Schembechler at Michigan for the last 10 years; Northern Illinois' **Jerry Pettibone**, a member of Jackie Sherrill's staff at Texas A&M; and former all-MAC quarterback **Cleve Bryant**, who returns to his alma mater, Ohio University.

I, Veer, Option, One-Back: Though the majority of the MAC teams run out of the I-formation, there is quite a bit of variation. Central Michigan uses more pure option than any other MAC team, Toledo favors the inside power game, Bowling Green and Western Michigan have shown one-back offenses in the past, and Northern Illinois has installed the veer this year.

Scheduling: As one of the nine Division I-A conferences in the country, the members of the MAC have made a commitment to scheduling quality non-conference opponents. MAC teams will face seven of the other eight—all except the Southwest—I-A conferences in 1985. Northern Illinois faces three Big 10 teams—Wisconsin, Iowa and Northwestern—on consecutive Saturdays in November. Other "name" teams on MAC schedules this year are Arizona (vs. Toledo), Michigan State and Army (vs. Western Michigan), Oklahoma State (vs. Miami), Kentucky (vs. Bowling Green), Purdue (vs. Ball State), Syracuse (vs. Kent State), and Duke (vs. Ohio).

California Bowl V: The Fifth Annual California Bowl will be played on December 14, 1985, in Fresno, California. The MAC Champion faces the winner of the Pacific Coast Athletic Association (PCAA) in the California Bowl. There will be one MAC-PCAA regular season match-up when Central Michigan hosts the University of Pacific on September 14.

Calling The MAC Race: Predicting the outcome of the MAC football race is never easy—the MAC News Media Association has an active string of 10 consecutive misses—and 1985 doesn't appear to be any easier. Making the task even more difficult than normal is the fact that the five teams that finished in the second division last year, Miami, Ball State, Eastern Michigan, Western Michigan and Kent State, all figure to be considerably improved this fall.

Balance: What it all points to is balance, a word that is prominent in the MAC dictionary. Six different teams have won the MAC Championship in the last eight years, and eight of the 10 teams have finished in the first division at least once in the last three seasons.

All factors point to another closely contested race for the MAC title with upsets every Saturday, and the championship not determined until mid-November.

MAC Hopes To Continue California Bowl Pattern

If past history repeats, the Mid-American Conference Champion will defeat the champion of the Pacific Coast Athletic Association (PCAA) in California Bowl V on December 14, 1985. In odd-numbered years, the MAC Champion is the "visiting" team and in even-numbered years, the PCAA Champion is the "visiting" team. The visitors have won each of the first four California Bowls.

Dramatic finishes are the trademark of the California Bowl. The first three California Bowls were all decided in the final 40 seconds, Cal Bowl I on a field goal with 15 seconds left, Cal Bowl II on a touchdown pass with 11 seconds left and Cal Bowl III on a defensive stand in the final minute of play.

The finish to California Bowl IV last year was different. PCAA Champion Nevada-Las Vegas left Bulldog Stadium with a 30-13 win over MAC Champion Toledo, but UNLV was later required to forfeit the victory due to the use of several ineligible players who had a major role in the Rebels' on-the-field success. Due to the forfeit, the California Bowl scoreboard reads 2-to-1 in favor of the MAC entering California Bowl V.

The concept of the California Bowl was born in the mid-1970's and became a reality in 1981 with the completion of Fresno State's 30,000 seat Bulldog Stadium. Sponsored by the Greater San Joaquin Valley Sports Association, the California Bowl is one of two closed-end bowl agreements matching the champions of two conferences. The other is the Rose Bowl.

The game itself is a culmination of bowl week activities. One of the other highlights is the visit to Valley Children's Hospital by senior members of the two competing teams. The hospital is the designated charity of the California Bowl.

With a theme of the "Battle of Champions—Fight For Life," the California Bowl has produced more than \$60,000 for the Valley Children's Hospital. Last May, the California Bowl presented a check for \$22,000 to the hospital from the receipts of California Bowl IV. Perhaps, more importantly than the funds raised for the hospital is the love and fellowship that develops between the football players and the hospitalized youngsters as a result of the "Buddy Booster" program that matches up the athletes and the children.

Fresno is located in the center of California and has a population of more than 300,000. The location plays a part in many of the activities leading up to the bowl game. For

visitors from the midwest, Fresno is within 100 miles of three national parks—Yosemite, Kings Canyon and Sequoia. Not much further away are the exciting city of San Francisco and the spectacular Pacific vistas at Big Sur, Carmel and the Monterey Peninsula.

Each of the first three California Bowls has been decided in the game's final 60 seconds with the MAC Champion emerging as the winner in Cal Bowls I and III.

Heavily-favored PCAA Champion San Jose rallied to move ahead of MAC Champion Toledo, 25-24, with less than a minute remaining in California Bowl I, but the Rockets came right back and won the game, 27-25, on Tony Lee's 41-yard field goal with 15 seconds left.

California Bowl II went even further as Fresno State overcame a 28-7 deficit to score 22 fourth quarter points and rally for a 29-28 victory over Bowling Green. The winning touchdown came with 11 seconds left.

California Bowl III was not quite as dramatic as its predecessors, but it took a Northern Illinois defensive stand in the game's final minute to preserve the Huskies' 20-13 triumph over PCAA Champion Cal State-Fullerton.

Though the victory had to be forfeited, Nevada-Las Vegas was impressive in its California Bowl IV victory over Toledo. The Rebels piled up more than 400 yards in total offense against UT's outstanding defense as All-America quarterback Randall Cunningham passed for two touchdowns and ran for a third in UNLV's 30-13 "win."

Dramatic finishes are not the only excitement produced in the California Bowl. The passing artistry of San Jose's Steve Clarkson, Bowling Green's Brian McClure, Fresno's Jeff Tedford and UNLV's Cunningham has resulted in high-scoring games; MAC running backs Arnold Smiley of Toledo, Chip Otten of Bowling Green, Lou Wicks of Northern Illinois and Steve Morgan of Toledo have all rushed for better than 100 yards. Clutch kicking performances by Toledo's Lee, Fresno's Scott Darrow and Northern Illinois' Vince Scott provided the winning points in the first three California Bowls.

Who will appear in California Bowl V on December 14 is anybody's guess. Seven different teams have made appearances so far with only Toledo making a return trip. Six different MAC teams have won the league title in the last eight years, and five different teams have won the PCAA title in the 1980's.

Can Toledo make its third trip to the bowl? Will either Bowling Green or Northern Illinois earn the right to make a second appearance? Or will one of the seven other MAC teams experience the thrill of the MAC title and trip to California. Out west in the PCAA, San Jose, Fresno, Fullerton and UNLV will be seeking return trips to the California Bowl, while Pacific, Long Beach, New Mexico State and Utah State will be bidding for their first visits to the bowl.

Winning the MAC Championship is the number one goal of every team in the league, and the trip to the California Bowl that goes with it adds to the honor.

Who the MAC's representative will be remains to be seen, but recent history indicates that whoever goes to Fresno will represent the league well. Since 1969, MAC teams have won 10 of their 12 bowl appearances. Toledo won three straight Tangerine Bowls from 1969-71, Miami beat Florida, Georgia and South Carolina in consecutive Tangerine Bowls in the mid-70's, and the MAC holds a 2-1 edge over the PCAA in the California Bowl.

Driscoll Named To Cal Bowl Post



Dr. Glen Driscoll, the president of the University of Toledo from 1972 until retiring this past June, has taken over as the new Executive Director of the California Bowl. He replaces Russ Sloan who resigned from the Cal Bowl position to become head of the Fresno Area Chamber of Commerce last spring.

Dr. Driscoll's appointment at the California Bowl was effective August 1.

As President of Toledo, Dr. Driscoll served for four years as the Chairman of the MAC Council of Presidents and was one of the strongest supporters of the MAC's involvement in the California Bowl. He was also at the head of the struggle to retain Division I-A status for the MAC.

A native of Sligo, Ohio, Dr. Driscoll earned his bachelor of arts degree in history from the University of Louisville and a master of arts degree in history and a doctor of philosophy degree from the University of Minnesota. Prior to coming to Toledo, he served as a professor of history and later Chancellor at the University of Missouri-St. Louis.

About the PCAA

Founded in 1969, the Pacific Coast Athletic Association (PCAA) is currently comprised of 10 schools in California, Nevada, Utah and New Mexico. The eight football-playing members of the PCAA are Cal State-Fullerton, Cal State-Long Beach, Fresno State, New Mexico State, San Jose State, Nevada-Las Vegas, University of Pacific and Utah State. The University of California-Irvine and University of California-Santa Barbara are also members of the PCAA, but do not sponsor football teams.

Enrollments at the PCAA members range from less than 5,000 at Pacific to more than 30,000 at Long Beach.

California Bowl I was a game of contrasts with the passing attack of PCAA Champion San Jose and the running game of MAC Champion Toledo. The diversity has not been as great in the last two years, but still the closeness of all three California Bowls indicates how evenly balanced the two leagues are. The MAC-PCAA marriage has produced one of the most exciting bowl games.

National Champion Leads BSU Defense

Ball State University's Brad Saar is probably the first Mid-American Conference football player to have lettered on a major college national championship football team.

Saar earned a monogram at Penn State as a sophomore linebacker in 1982 when the Nittany Lions finished the season ranked first in the country. The product of Deerfield, Ill., and 1981 graduate of Stevenson High School played in all 12 Penn State games that season, primarily on special teams, as the Nittany Lions posted an 11-1 record and



beat Georgia in the Sugar Bowl to earn the national title.

"When I returned for my third season, I talked with the linebackers coach and Coach (Joe) Paterno, and I just felt I had a better opportunity to play someplace else," Saar reveals.

After spending one year at the College of Lake County in Grayslake, Ill., Saar was recruited to Ball State and quickly became the leader of the BSU defense last fall. He topped the Cardinals and ranked ninth in the MAC in tackles with 135, earning all-league honorable mention.

Record-breaking McClure Chases Flutie

There is little doubt that Brian McClure, Bowling Green's 6'6" senior quarterback, is one of the best players in the history of the Mid-American Conference. Before McClure graduates, he will hold every school and conference record for passing offense, and he will also have added his name to several NCAA records.



The winner of the 1984 Jefferson Trophy as the Most Valuable Player in the MAC, McClure hopes to repeat that role again in 1985. He has been named the league's Offensive Player of the Year each of the last two seasons, and can become the first MAC player to ever earn first team all-conference honors for all four years.

Heading into his senior season, Brian has thrown for more career passing yards than any other rising senior in Division I-A history. Mc-

Clure has thrown for 7,606 yards, almost 500 yards more than what Doug Flutie took into his senior season. McClure will make a run for Flutie's career passing yardage mark of 10,579 and is almost assured, barring injury, of setting a new NCAA record for career pass completions.

A starter since the third game of his freshman campaign, McClure has passed for 200 or more yards in 22 of 31 games. He has nine 300-yard games to his credit and a pair of 400-yard efforts.

Perhaps one of the nation's foremost authorities on the passing game, Brigham Young University head coach LaVell Edwards declared McClure "a young Marc Wilson" after the Falcon signal caller completed 30 of 46 passes for 362 yards against Edwards' Cougar team in 1983.

Despite the fact that the Chippewas run the option as well as most schools, DeBoer still caught 40 passes for a school-record 831 yards and a school-record nine touchdowns in 1984. He's also tied for the lead in career TD catches with 15 and is second in career receiving yardage with 1,481.



"For John's sake, it's kind of a shame that he doesn't play for a school that passes the ball more," said CMU Coach Herb Deromedi. "Needless to say, we're glad he's a Chippewa."

DeBoer, a graduate student in accounting, is equally adept in the classroom where his 3.64 grade-point-average earned him first team CoSIDA Academic All-American honors in 1984. He was also third team Football News for his playing ability as well as All-MAC and All-MAC Academic.

Ferretti Makes Impression

Mario Ferretti is an image-breaker. No, better make that an image-DESTROYER.

When a field goal is attempted anywhere that football is played, the mind's eye conjures up a vision of a small, slender athlete heading for the gridiron to "kick a touchdown." A 5-foot-8, 145-pounder to boot the ball long and straight for three points.

Well, not true at Eastern Michigan.

When the Hurons are in need of a quick three points, out comes a player that could pass for an offensive guard or maybe a defensive tackle.

Mario Ferretti, all 6-foot-1 and 220 pounds of kicker is the man that EMU head coach Jim Harkema calls upon for instant offense and although Ferretti has played just 10 games for the Hurons, he has proven to be an invaluable offensive force.

Mario booted a 35-yard field goal,



his third of the game, with just 0:02 left in the game to help Eastern tie a heavily favored Central Michigan squad, 16-16, last October in EMU's Rynearson Stadium.

"That game-winning field goal against Central meant a lot to me because it showed people that the Eastern football team was for real,"

Ferretti said, "There was a lot of pressure but I just tried to relax and not overkick it. I knew as soon as I hit it that it was good. Bob (holder Bob Hirschmann) and I looked at each other and smiled."

Ferretti made a lot of the Huron faithful smile in 1984 by making 11 of 15 field goal attempts, including a 48-yarder against Ball State which ranks as the second-longest in EMU history. He also connected on 15 of 16 extra point kicks in '84. A transfer from Northern Michigan, Ferretti was named second-team All-Mid-American Conference by the league's football coaches.

Northern's loss was Eastern's gain and with one season of eligibility remaining, Ferretti will boot himself to the top of all of the EMU kicking records.

And hopefully boot the Hurons to the top of the MAC football ladder.

We feel we have some good front-line people on both offense and defense, but we are shallow at most positions. We cannot afford many injuries if we are to be as successful as we think we can be this season."

Versatile Nix Fills Many Roles

In this day and age of specialists in football, Kent State University's Derrick Nix is a rarity—he's a jack of all trades, one who can't be defined by a specific position, and one who just gets the job(s) done.

For the record, Nix is a running back, a position he played better last year (720 yards rushing) than any KSU running back since Art Best ran for 1,040 yards in 1976.

But Nix is the prototype all purpose back. Do you need a pass receiver? He was third on the team in receptions with 30 in 1984.

How about a kick and/or punt return specialist. Nix averaged a steady 7.3 yards on punt returns and nearly 16 yards per kickoff return.

Nix's all around talents have earned him national recognition. As



a sophomore in 1984, the 5-9, 198-pound Lorain native ranked 24th in the nation in all purpose run-

ning, averaging 116.3 yards per game to rank fifth among Mid-American Conference players.

Just what makes Nix click as an all purpose talent?

"He's just a darn good athlete," said Kent State Coach Dick Scesniak. "He's versatile—he can run, catch a pass, return kicks and punts—that's a lot packaged in one guy.

"When you lose him, you lose four positions on the field. He's an intelligent guy and his worth is well documented when you look at the statistics."

The 1984 season was a rewarding and busy one for Derrick Nix who received a big reward from the league coaches when he was selected to the All-MAC Second Team.

Swarn Is Top Returning Rusher

"My goal is to break Miami's all-time rushing record," states the Redskins' junior tailback George Swarn. "I'm nearly halfway there and Coach Hitchens knows that I am after his mark."

Bob Hitchens, Miami's offensive backfield coach and only the second player to have his jersey #40 retired, established the Redskins' career rushing record with a total of 3,118 yards gained from 1971-73.

Swarn, a 6-0, 201-pounder, rushed for 1,282 yards in 269 carries last year to rank second in the Mid-American Conference and sixth in the nation with an average of 116.5 yards. He now has a two-year total



of 1,549 yards but needs 1,570 to break Hitchens' record.

In the opening game of the season last year Swarn used his 10.45 speed in the 100 meters to set a Miami record with a 98-yard touchdown scamper from the line of scrimmage. He ended the game with 239 yards—the second best single-game total in Redskin history.

In addition to being the top returning rusher in the MAC, he is also the #1 all-purpose runner back as he averaged 146.9 yards per game with 187 pass receiving yards and 147 kickoff return yards to go along with his rushing total.

"I would trade my records for a winning season," remarked Swarn. "But we feel that this is the year to prove that the Miami Magic is back!"





Swearingen Emerges At QB

The 1984 football season saw Ohio University senior Dennis Swearingen develop into a premier Division I quarterback. After attempting only one pass in 1983, Swearingen quickly proved himself in 1984 by finishing in the National Top 40 in passing efficiency.

The Martins Ferry, Ohio, native completed 117 of 185 passes for 1,211 yards and four touchdowns while starting only eight games. In the third week of the season, against Ball State, Swearingen established himself as the starting Ohio quarterback as he threw for 188 yards and three touchdowns. This initial performance earned him the Mid-American Conference Player-of-the-Week honors.

Swearingen also has excelled off the playing field by gaining Academic All-American status. A 4.0 student in high school, Swearingen currently is



carrying a 3.36 grade-point average in Ohio's difficult Accounting Program.

Swearingen disclosed that college was a big transition from high school. "Football seemed more like a job initially. You make a mistake, and someone easily can replace you." Nobody knows this more than Swearingen as he was delegated to back-up quarterback his first two seasons before surfacing as the starting signal-caller last year. "I learned a lot as back-up quarterback to Donny Harrison my first two years. He really helped me to mature by developing my quarterbacking skills," said Swearingen.

With three years under his belt, the Ohio coaching staff feels Swearingen has the experience and leadership to lead the Bobcats to a winning season in the competitive MAC.



However, on the field Williams is,



Toledo's defense allowed MAC opponents an average of just 9.1 points per game.

185 Pound Frosh Grows To All-America

When a 185-pound freshman linebacker named John Offerdahl showed up at Western Michigan University's 1982 fall training camp, he wasn't on a full scholarship and had outside hopes of making the 50-man traveling squad.

A week later, he'd impressed the coaching staff enough to be awarded a full scholarship. A pre-season foot injury to Pat Clements and auto accident injuries suffered by captain Les Garrett created an opening at inside linebacker.

Offerdahl was named to the starting lineup for the season opener and has been there ever since.

As a freshman in 1982, he made 149 tackles to rank second in the Mid-American. In 1983, he led the MAC in tackles with 194, a figure that is a school season record; and



was picked on the All-MAC team. In 1984 came another All-MAC section

and third-team Associated Press All-American honors. He had 182 stops for the year.

Offerdahl is WMU's career leader for tackles (525) and forced fumbles (13). The previous standards were 346 and five.

Since that freshman year, he's built his weight to 230 pounds and increased his bench press from 225 to 375 pounds.

Offerdahl was in Coach Jack Harbaugh's first recruiting class following his appointment in December, 1981, and wasn't even considered for a partial scholarship to begin with.

"At the time, we didn't place him very high on our recruiting list but we finally offered him a partial scholarship," reviewed Harbaugh. "Once he got here though, he made an immediate impression with his hard work."

Quoting Coach Harbaugh: "We have better depth than at any time since we came here in 1982. In the past we have had to rely to a greater extent on freshmen and maybe had to play them before they were ready. If a freshman breaks into our lineup this fall, it will be because he is a quality player. After leading the nation in scoring defense in 1982, we slipped some the last two years. We made steps toward improvement in the spring, reacting quicker and flowing to the ball much better. Hopefully, the game experience and a better understanding of our defense will produce additional improvement."

MAC's Most Valuable Player Receives Jefferson Trophy

The Mid-American Conference's Most Valuable Player annually receives the Jefferson Trophy, an award conceived by the Downtown Athletic Club of Toledo.

The award was first presented in 1982 at a banquet in Toledo. The trophy, a glass sculpture of a football with the MAC seal etched in it, is on permanent display at the College Football Hall of Fame in Kings Island, Ohio.



Ray Bentley of Central Michigan won the inaugural Jefferson Trophy in 1982; Tim Tyrrell, quarterback of league champion Northern Illinois, won the award in 1983; and record-shattering quarterback Brian McClure of Bowling Green won the 1984 award.

The winner of the award is selected from among 10 nominees—one from each MAC school—by a panel of the 10 head football coaches and 20 media representatives. The winner is kept secret until the actual announcement at the banquet.

Guest speakers for the first three banquets have been former Pittsburgh Steeler Rocky Bleier, former Miami and current Michigan Coach Bo Schembechler, and former Miami and Ohio State Coach Woody Hayes. Both the 1983 and 1984 banquets drew sellout crowds of 500 football fans.

The fourth annual Jefferson Trophy banquet will be held at Meadowbrook Hall in Toledo on Tuesday, December 3, 1985.

The Jefferson Trophy serves a three-fold purpose, according to Bill Buehrer, the founder of the award. "First, we want to enhance the visibility of the individual nominees. Second, we wish to add to the prestige and public awareness of the Mid-American Conference. And third, we hope to foster a deepened feeling of fraternity and league identity among coaches, players and administrators by bringing them together for this program."

The first three Jefferson Trophy recipients were very deserving of the honor. Bentley was the MAC Defensive Player of the Year in 1982, and the very next spring was a standout linebacker for the USFL Champion Michigan Panthers.

Tyrrell was the inspirational leader of the Northern Illinois Huskies in 1983, guiding them to their first MAC football championship and to a win over Cal State-Fullerton in California Bowl III.

McClure became the first junior to win the Jefferson Trophy in 1984. The MAC Offensive Player of the Year as both a sophomore and junior, he has passed for more than 7,600 yards in his Bowling Green career.

CMU Trio Stars On Field and In Classroom

Three fifth-year seniors from Central Michigan epitomize the term student-athlete. John DeBoer, Kevin Egnatuk and Steve Sklenar have all earned first team All-MAC honors and all have grade point averages of 3.64 or better. All three players will be taking graduate courses in addition to finishing up work on their undergraduate degrees this fall.

DeBoer, a split end from Grosse Pointe, was a first team Academic All-America and a third team All-America selection last year. Despite playing in a run-oriented offense, he is threatening the MAC career records for pass receiving yards and touchdown passes. He has caught 67 passes for 1,481 yards and 15 touchdowns. DeBoer has a 3.64 grade point average, majoring in accounting.

Egnatuk, an outside linebacker from East Lansing, missed almost all of last season with a broken bone in his foot, and received an additional year of eligibility. In 1983, he made 112 tackles, 23 of them for losses totalling 112 yards, and was selected first team All-MAC and second team Academic All-America. Egnatuk has a 3.67 grade point average, majoring in finance.

Sklenar, an outside linebacker from Muskegon, rose to prominence last year following the injury to Egnatuk. In two years as a starter on the CMU defense, he has made a total of 106 tackles, 15 of them for losses. Last season, he earned first team All-MAC and first team Academic All-MAC honors. Sklenar has a 3.82 grade point average, majoring in accounting.


