

Animal Facility Orientation and Hands-On Training

Facility Orientation Training must be completed prior to being granted unsupervised access to an animal facility.

Hands-on training in animal handling techniques is provided by the PI, Animal Facility Managers, Veterinary Staff and/or Professional Animal Care Staff.

These training sessions provide an introduction to facilities, as well as an overview of the laboratory rodent and other laboratory animals, in both a lecture and hands on format.

Basic handling, restraint, and other techniques will be demonstrated. Class participants have the opportunity to practice their newly-acquired skills under the supervision of experienced trainers.

Prerequisites for Facility Orientation and all other hands on training courses include:

- Completion of Animal Handler Occupational Health Program requirements.
- Completion of required CITI training.
- Completion of Lab Safety (OLFS) training courses indicated on the Safety Training form completed by your supervisor.
