
The American Board of Surgery has changed the way diplomates receive Maintenance of Certification (MOC, or Continuous Certification/CC) credit when participating in continuing medical education (CME) activities. Read the full article [here](#).

Effective July 1, 2023, ABS discontinued self-reporting of credits.

If an ABS surgeon wants to have CME credit count towards their ABS CC requirements, the request will need to come through the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) Program Activity and Reporting System (PARS).

The CME office will report your information; however, we need your consent to do so.

- When you claim your CME credit, you will also be claiming ABS MOC, if the activity has been registered for ABS MOC
- Per the ACCME, you must engage in an evaluation where you have identified change in knowledge, skill, or performance. Credit may not be granted if the evaluation is incomplete or misrepresented.
