#### *Is Grief a Mental Disorder?*

According to the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual for Mental Disorders (DSM-5-TR), 'prolonged grief' is categorized as a mental disorder that may require psychiatric intervention. While the dominating discourse suggests that clinicians should now focus on the intensity and duration of grief, another school of thought suggests that this clinical diagnosis may actually create psychological injury for individuals who are grieving the death of someone in their lives, especially after stigmatized deaths like suicide. In this webinar, Dr. Donna Schuurman will discuss the practical and psychological implications of 'prolonged grief disorder (PGD)' and provide an alternate framework, based on a humanistic model of grief-informed best practices, to prevent risks of psychological injury and to support individuals who are grieving.

# The Clot Thickens: Navigating the Gray Zones of Pulmonary Embolism

Covenant Inpatient Physician Practices - Grand Rounds

## Course Description

This session will use four challenging pulmonary embolism cases to examine high-stakes decision-making beyond standard algorithms. Through interactive case discussion, learners will review the evaluation and management of clot in transit, the normotensive but clinically deteriorating patient, high-risk PE in the setting of major contraindication to anticoagulation, and persistent dyspnea after acute PE. Emphasis will be placed on risk stratification, multidisciplinary decision-making, fair and balanced review of therapeutic options, and structured follow-up for patients with ongoing symptoms. The goal is to help learners move from recognizing PE to managing the difficult cases in which timing, nuance, and judgment matter most.

## Objectives

1. Differentiate high-risk, intermediate-high-risk, and clinically deteriorating phenotypes of acute pulmonary embolism using hemodynamics, biomarkers, imaging, and clinical trajectory.
2. Formulate an evidence-based management approach for acute PE complicated by clot in transit or impending hemodynamic collapse.
3. Assess reperfusion options in patients with high-risk PE who have major contraindications to systemic thrombolysis, including catheter-based and surgical strategies.
4. Develop a structured diagnostic and referral strategy for patients with persistent dyspnea after PE, including evaluation for post-PE syndrome and chronic thromboembolic disease.
