## A Unique EM Rotation Scholarship Opportunity for Students Underrepresented in Medicine

Central Michigan University (CMU) College of Medicine offers a unique opportunity for medical students from minority groups currently underrepresented in medicine. Students who qualify gain a unique opportunity to complete their clinical rotation in emergency medicine (EM) as a result of our new scholarship program. The program provides \$1,500 for travel, housing and living expenses. College staff provides assistance in arranging accommodations with options ranging from hotel accommodations to housing with current residents.

EM clinical rotations at the College are highly-aligned and integrated with our EM residency program which ensures wide exposure to faculty, high clinical volumes, and experience at three very different clinical sites. Students rotate at Covenant HealthCare and two locations at Ascension St. Mary's Hospital in Saginaw, Michigan. Saginaw provides a large patient base of 800,000 people across 14 surrounding counties. These patients come from urban, rural and suburban populations with diverse backgrounds – many of whom are significantly underserved.
