GENERAL INFORMATION

Camp is Monday- Thursday (with the exception of Friday, August 1) beginning Tuesday, July 1 through Friday, August 1, 2025.

Half Day Program:

(Campers aged 3 through 13) **Morning Session: 9am-Noon** Afternoon Session: 1pm-4pm Tuition Cost- \$700.00

Full Day Program:

(Campers aged 10 through 13 if determined appropriate for full day services) 9am-4pm

Camper must bring a packed lunch Tuition Cost- \$1400.00

*Financial Assistance is available Balance is to be paid in full the first day of camp





SSC PROVIDES:

- Individual Therapy Plan and **Progress Summary:**
 - A therapy plan is developed for all campers based on assessment results. At the end of SSC, a parent conference is held to review the child's progress over the course of SSC.

Evidence Based Intervention:

- Children receive daily, intensive, therapy services in small and large groups. Unfortunately, our program is not designed to support individuals who require a one to one learning environment.
- Proficiency Training:
 - Our graduate clinicians receive supervision from certified, licensed speech-language pathologists.

Behavioral Considerations

Age and Qualifications

• Applicants must turn three before the first day of camp and must not be older than 13 on the first day of camp.

Recommendation

• Applicants must be able to provide a current IEP or documentation of speech therapy services and permission to speak with current speech-language pathologist. Attendance:

• Campers are expected to attend all 20 days of camp unless they are experiencing symptoms of illness

• Prior to acceptance, the nature and severity of each individual's

communication disorder are considered. Participants who demonstrate behaviors harmful to themselves or others or whose needs cannot be met in a group setting will not be considered for SSC. A child who demonstrates significant wandering risk will not be eligible. Children with school behavior plans which require a paraprofessional or trained professional will not be eligible. Children may be admitted on a trial basis at the time of the

evaluation. If the participant attends less than three weeks of the program due to behavior, SSC will provide a prorated tuition refund.
