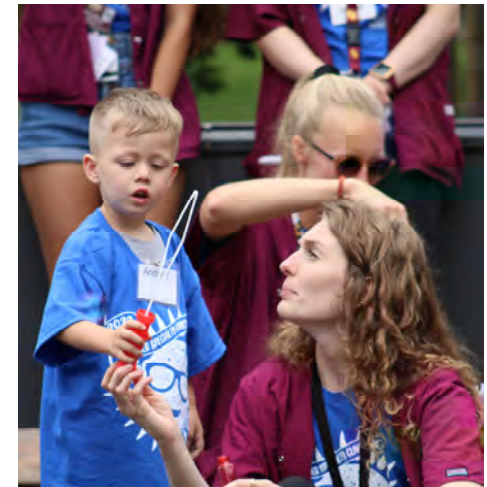

“Superhero Speech Camp”





SSC Provides:

- **Individualized Therapy Plan and Progress Summary:** A treatment plan is developed from assessment results and information provided by parents. At the end of SSC, there is a conference between clinicians and parents to review the child's progress.
- **Evidence Based Therapy:** Children receive daily, intensive therapy services in small and large group settings. Our program is not designed to support individuals requiring a one to one learning environment.
- **Proficiency Training:** Our graduate clinicians receive direct supervision from certified, licensed, speech language pathologists.

Eligibility:

- **Age and qualifications:** Applicants must be between the ages of 3 and 14. They must be able to participate in small and large group activities with others of the same age.
- **Recommendation:** Must be able to provide current IEP or documentation of speech therapy services and permission to speak with current speech-language pathologist.
- **Attendance:** Children are expected to attend all 21 days of SSC unless they are experiencing symptoms of COVID or other illness.
- **Behavioral Considerations:** Prior to acceptance, the nature and severity of each individual's communication disorder are considered. Participants who demonstrate behaviors harmful to themselves or others or whose needs cannot be met in a group setting will not be considered for SSC. A child who demonstrates elopement or poses a significant wandering risk will not be eligible. Children with school behavior plans which require a para-professional or trained professional will not be eligible. Children may be admitted on a trial basis at the time of the evaluation. If the participant attends less than three weeks of the program due to behavior, SSC will provide a prorated tuition refund.

Schedule:

Each participant is placed in a group best suited for their clinical and social needs. Placement is determined after all applications have been received and is based on availability.

Camp will be offered Monday–Thursday. We will start June 28, 2023 and end August 3, 2023. There will not be camp on Monday, July 3rd or Tuesday, July 4th, 2023.

Half Day Program (ages 3 to 14)

- AM Session 9 am-Noon
- PM Session 1 pm-4 pm

Full Day Program (ages 10-14 if determined appropriate for full day services)

- 9 am-4 pm Child must bring a packed lunch.

Costs and Tuition

- **Half Day**= \$700.00
- **Full Day**= \$1400.00
- **Financial Assistance is available.**
- Payment is to be paid in full the first day of clinic.
