Investigate the development and importance of the aeronautic and shipbuilding industries. Get an up-close look at the medical techniques and advancements used by surgeons during and after the war. Uncover the personal realities of individual civilians by recreating a wartime meal from scratch. You'll play an active role in investigating the past, researching the ways in which civilians were impacted by the war, and how they in turn affected the way the war played out.

We'll spend two weeks in two of Scotland's largest cities, soaking up the thriving day- and night-life that characterizes these contemporary spaces. We'll interact with local students and professors eager to share their knowledge with us. From the latest in fine dining to snacks at a centuries-old pub, we'll enjoy Scottish food culture in all of its glory. And we'll breathe in the society and culture of two beautiful cities while learning about some of the most important events in modern history.
