

Scholarship Awards for Continuing Students

Anne Miller-Quimper Memorial Award

The Anne Miller-Quimper Scholarship Award was established in 1991 by friends and family in memory of Anne Miller-Quimper (1940-1980), an alumnus of the school psychology program, to support thesis and dissertation research of school psychology students.

Project criteria: A study that involves working with children from birth to age 5, children or youth from diverse ethnic, racial, or low-income backgrounds, or studies involving students with low-incidence disabilities. Proposal in other areas that have a high probability of being published can be considered. The award is for empirical research and not for opinion-based papers, theoretical position papers, nor for support of studies involving existing data sets. Rather, it is for assessment or interventions that require careful and systematic objective data collection in a prospective manner. Proposals that appear to lead to publishable studies receive priority.

Eligibility:

- Graduate student in School Psychology
- Application deadline: March 1st

Required application materials:

• Brief description of the research project including the rationale and purpose, the population and setting to be targeted, the methodology and analyses.

Carl and Sharon Johnson Scholarship

Established in 2019 by Carl Merle Johnson and Sharon Bradley-Johnson, both retired Central Michigan University Psychology Professors. The award will support a non-renewable scholarship for at least one undergraduate student annually. Recipients will be enrolled in a qualifying major or minor within the College of Liberal Arts & Social Sciences' Department of Psychology. Recipients will be pursuing the Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst (BCaBA) curriculum, and will have at least half of the curriculum completed.

Eligibility:

- Undergraduate student enrolled in a major or minor in the Department of Psychology
- Pursuing the Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst (BCaBA) curriculum with 50% of the curriculum completed
- Application deadline: March 1st



Dr. Angela Freymuth Caveney Dissertation Endowment

Established in 2020 by Dr. Angela Freymuth Caveney '96, '98, '02 and Mr. Forest Caveney in the Department of Psychology within the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences. Award will be used to facilitate graduate research in clinical psychology and behavioral neuroscience by providing funding for dissertation research.

Eligibility:

- Graduate students in good standing within either the clinical psychology or behavioral neuroscience programs and admitted to doctoral candidacy
- Candidates must have a dissertation proposal that has been approved by the full dissertation committee.

James and Catherine Steinmetz Graduate Scholarship

The James and Catherine Steinmetz Graduate Scholarship was established by Joseph E. and Sandra S. Steinmetz in honor of Joseph's parents. Joseph E. Steinmetz, Ph.D., earned a B.S. in Psychology (1977) and an M.A. in Experimental Psychology (1979) from Central Michigan University. He has held numerous faculty and administrator appointments, including executive vice president and provost at Ohio State University and, chancellor of the University of Arkansas (2016-2021).

Eligibility:

- Graduate student in experimental psychology, studying neuroscience, within the College of Liberals Arts & Social Sciences
- Abstract of current research

Joanna M. Russ Memorial Undergraduate Research and Presentation Grant

Established in 2004 by family and friends of Joanna M. Russ, the income from this endowment will be used to support a research and presentation grant. Income may be used for expenses related to research and/or travel to present the results of the student's research. Priority will be given to research related to CHARGE syndrome, but other research topics that qualify are autism, autism spectrum disorder and low incidence disabilities such as deaf blindness.

Eligibility:

- Undergraduate student enrolled at Central Michigan University
- Application deadline: March 1st
- Minimum GPA of 3.0
- Faculty supervision of research project
- One page summary of the project
- Project that falls within one of the following areas
 - o Cause and nature of behavior difficulties in children with CHARGE syndrome
 - Educational, family, medical, social or other difficulties experienced by children with CHARGE syndrome or other genetic syndromes
 - o Studies related to autism and autism spectrum disorder
 - \circ $\;$ Studies related to other low incident disabilities such as deaf blindness



Wilbert Wright Endowed Memorial Fund

Established in 2001 by Geraldine Wright (Class of 1977) in memory of her husband Wilbert Wright, Ph.D., former member of the CMU Counseling Center staff.

Eligibility

- First generation college student with full-time enrollment status
- Junior or first semester senior status
- Majoring in Psychology
- Minimum 3.0 GPA
- Application deadline: March 31st
