Other tasks include recreational activities with residents and meal assistance. Hours vary, including nights and weekends.

Hours vary and include nights and weekends.

Volunteers must complete an application, attend training, submit to a criminal background check, and complete a TB test with negative results. All background and testing costs are paid by the agency. Hours vary, including evenings and weekends.
