Topic of the Month: The Making of Earth Day

Earth Day, April 22nd, marks of the anniversary of the birth of the modern environmental movement. Today, it is a day of environmental activism and awareness.

Prior to the first Earth Day, mainstream America was largely unaware of environmental problems. There was no Environmental Protection Agency and no laws regulating pollution, air, or water quality. Public awareness only began to shift in 1962 with the release Silent Spring, a book that linked ecology to human health.

In 1969, Wisconsin senator Gaylord Nelson, inspired to take action, partnered with young activist Denis Hayes to plan a large-scale demonstration. They chose April 22nd, 1970, between colleges' spring break and finals, to appeal to students. This massive protest, which actually mobilized 10% of the U.S. population, was the first Earth Day.

Since then, every year, Earth Day has been a global day of celebration and environmental activism. For its 50th anniversary in 2020, Earth Day inspired over 1 billion people to participate in environmental actions, exemplifying the powerful legacy of Earth Day worldwide.
