


Every April, CS celebrates Earth Month by facilitating events and partnering with groups from the campus community to highlight their projects.

Before the 70s, there were very few legal or regulatory mechanisms to protect our environment. In 1970, Senator Gaylord Nelson created Earth Day as a way to draw attention to this issue on a national level. Twenty million Americans demonstrated all across the country that day, and their efforts paid off! In December of 1970, Congress authorized the creation of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

This doesn't mean our work is over. While Earth Day's a time we've set aside to appreciate our planet, we should be conscious of our environmental impact year-round. Keep this in mind as you're celebrating Earth Day this April!
