Tisch Mikhail Lewis is an artist who is interested in depicting mental health situations in their artwork. Sometimes, their work is straightforward: using scientific phenomena such as craniofacial duplication, Lewis makes self-portraits under the mental health concept of splitting. Other times, Lewis uses duplication to literally depict the process of going through an episode or situation while also arriving at the end of it. Lewis draws from a variety of mental health situations they've experienced in their lifetime, but primarily the misdiagnosis they dealt with while pursuing gender affirming hormone therapy (GAHT) in the beginning of the pandemic (2020-2021). She is a 2013 BFA graduate from Central Michigan University.
