AUTHORIZATION OF PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY

The Hill Pointe School

Recitals:

- 1. The Michigan legislature has provided for the establishment of public school academies as part of the Michigan public school system by enacting Act No. 362 of the Public Acts of 1993.
- 2. The Michigan legislature has mandated that public school academy contracts be issued on a competitive basis taking into consideration the resources available for the proposed public school academy, the population to be served by the proposed public school academy, and the educational goals to be achieved by the proposed public school academy.
- 3. The Michigan legislature has mandated that authorizing bodies establish by resolution the method of selection, length of term, and number of members of the board of directors.
- 4. According to this legislation, the Central Michigan University Board of Trustees, as the governing body of a state public university, is an authorizing body empowered to issue contracts to organize and operate public school academies.
- 5. The Central Michigan University Board of Trustees has requested applications for organizing public school academies and has reviewed the applications according to the provisions set forth by the Michigan legislature.
- 6. The Central Michigan University Board of Trustees has established chartering policies in addition to the policy titled *Public School Academy: Method of Selection, Appointment, and Removal* as required by the Michigan legislature.
- 7. The university president or designee has recommended the issuance of a contract to charter as a public school academy to The Hill Pointe School for a term not to exceed five (5) years.
- 8. The Hill Pointe School's application has been submitted under Act 362 of the Public Acts of 1993, being part 6A of the Revised School Code, being sections 380.501 to 380.507 of the Michigan Compiled Laws.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the University Board approves and authorizes the execution of a contract to charter a public school academy to The Hill Pointe School and authorizes the chair of the board of trustees to execute a contract to charter as a public school academy and related documents between The Hill Pointe School and the Central Michigan University Board of Trustees, provided that, before execution of the contract, the university president or designee affirms that all terms of the contract have been agreed upon and The Hill Pointe School is able to comply with all terms and conditions of the contract.

New Endowments

The Ann Marie Kelliher Memorial Fund

Established in 2019 by J.P. Kelliher, family, and friends, in memory of J.P.'s mother, Ann Marie Kelliher. This scholarship was created because of Ann's belief, through her own personal journey, that counseling brings healing. She developed a passion to see others find the same kind of healing and restoration. She also was a longtime advocate for victimized women and adults with special needs. Ann passed away in 2017. The award will support undergraduate students pursuing a major in Social Work who have a cumulative minimum GPA of 2.5 and demonstrate financial need. Preference will be given to student(s) who submit an essay detailing their volunteerism with an organization serving "Women at Risk International."

The Claudia E. Marchildon Memorial Scholarship Fund

Established in 2022 by Mr. David H. Bingham in memory of his dear friend and CMU alumna, Miss Claudia E. Marchildon '79. Claudia was an accomplished and respected member of the Speech Language Pathology community and active in the profession at the state and national level. Claudia passed away in 2020. This renewable scholarship will support undergraduate students in the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders intending to pursue Speech-Language Pathology. Preference will be given to recipients demonstrating financial need.

Olaf W. Steg Memorial Endowment

Established in 2022 by Kenneth '71 and Nancy '72 Raymond, both graduates of Central Michigan University (CMU). Kenneth earned a Master of Business Administration and Nancy earned a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics. In 1968, Kenneth was drafted into the Army and sent to Vietnam. In 1970, Dr. Steg, who was Dean of Graduate Studies at CMU, provided Ken with an unconditional acceptance to the university allowing Ken an early exit from the Army. Soon after, Ken learned that the troop he was in suffered great losses and to this day believes Dr. Steg saved his life. This renewable scholarship will support a Junior or Senior pursuing any degree who demonstrates financial need.

STEM Scholarship

Established in 2022 by CMU faculty members Dr. Leela Rakesh, Dr. Anja Mueller, Dr. Lisa Gandy, Dr. Choon Lee, to support and encourage students to complete their degree in a STEM related program. Student must be majoring in or intending to major in one of the following: Biology, Chemistry/ Biochemistry, Computer Science, Engineering, Earth and Atmospheric Science, Information Technology, Information Systems/Management Information Systems, Mathematics, Neuroscience, Physics, STAD (Statistics, Actuarial and Data Sciences), or Systems Engineering. Student will be an incoming freshman, current freshman, or sophomore with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0. First preference will be given to students who have demonstrated experience in or commitment to working with historically underserved or underprivileged populations, or experience living or working in diverse environments. Of the students meeting the above first preference, preference will then be given to first-generation college students or international students. Enrolled students must provide a letter of recommendation. The scholarship may be renewed up to four times following the initial award.

Sally Wilt Physics Endowment

Established in 2022 to honor Sally Wilt. The award is to support a student(s) who has the desire to study Physics and enter the profession at an engineering or STEM-related employer. Preference will be given to incoming freshman who intends to pursue a degree in Physics. Recipients will have a cumulative minimum GPA of 3.0.

Endowment Criteria Changes

Mark L. Bennett Memorial Endowment

Established in 1985 by family and friends of Mark L. Bennett. Mr. Bennett served as a volunteer for Special Olympics Michigan. Recipients of the Mark L. Bennett Memorial Endowment must be enrolled in the College of Education and Human Services studying Special Education.

Carl V. and Margaret Hahn Furney Scholarship

Established in 2007 by the estate of Carl V. and Margaret Hahn Furney. Carl '39 and Margaret '36 both graduated from CMU and devoted their careers to education. Award is renewable and will support full- or part-time students who are the head of a sole parent household and demonstrate financial need. Preference will be given to recipients pursuing major/s related to Education.

JoAnn Hinds Fund for Beaver Island Experience

Established in 2021 by JoAnn Hinds '72, '77. After receiving her undergraduate and graduate degrees from CMU, JoAnn taught science at Clifford Smart Junior High School in Walled Lake and at Linden Middle School. In 1982, she went to work with her father, who was nearing retirement, at Diamond Die & Mold and later bought the company from him. JoAnn's love for Beaver Island and passion for the sciences is something that she would like all students to have an opportunity to experience. The intent of this fund is to offset the out-of-pocket costs students incur to participate in the annual class held on Beaver Island entitled "Introduction to Field Biology" (or its future equivalent). Should the above criteria become unfulfillable or obsolete, the funds will support a scholarship assisting students to experience Beaver Island.

The Scott L. Pranger Central Michigan University Scholarship

Scott Pranger is a 1983 graduate of Central Michigan University and a 1979 graduate of Shelby High School. As the first member of his family to earn a four-year degree, he went on to build a highly profitable international business, EQI, Ltd. Mr. Pranger credits his humble, yet values-rich upbringing and strong work ethic as the basis for his success. Mr. Pranger is a philanthropist who gives generously of his time and financial resources. In addition to establishing four up-to-full-cost of attendance scholarships at CMU, he has supported renovation of Grawn Hall and Athletics.
