On the cusp of President MacKinnon's investiture, CMU MI-ACE leveraged the opportunity to bring his mentor, Dr. Beverly Davenport, into conversation with former Board of Trustees and Advancement Board Chair, Sarah **Opperman**. Dr. Davenport spoke on what it meant for her to identify as a woman in executive leadership in higher education, most recently serving as chancellor at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville. Possessing both a corporate and higher education perspective, Past Advancement Board Chair Opperman shared experiences that mirrored Beverly's encounters in the academy. Dr. Davenport spoke openly on the ways she prioritized her family and other personal needs, even during moments when a high-pressure job was in direct competition with the things that mattered the most to her. Both women spoke on the importance of asserting their knowledge and expertise within male-dominated spaces, holding colleagues accountable for their behavior, and actively choosing to refrain from second-guessing the value that women bring to a team. Trustee Regine Beauboeuf closed out the discussion, inspiring the collective to believe in the differences they continue to make.

Dr. Galarowicz served as interim Dean for the College of Science and Engineering, co-PI with the NSF ADVANCE Catalyst Grant, in addition to remaining incredibly active as an Advisory Board Member. Other awardees included Dr. Itzel Marquez, who was the recipient of the Stan L. Shingles Award for Distinction in Mentorship, as well as the Midland Area Community Foundation, who were recognized for their service in the community with the Outstanding Social Justice Leadership in Community Service Award. 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KEYNOTE: PROVOST PAULA LANCASTER

Dr. Paula Lancaster began her role as the Dean of the College of Education and Human Services at Central Michigan University in July 2020.

She is a professor of special education and has served in the roles of Department Chair and Director of Teacher Education. After receiving her B. S. in Special Education, she was a high school special education teacher for eight years. During this time she completed her M.S. in Curriculum and Supervision and a certification in Educational Leadership while becoming a building level administrator. She completed her Ph.D. in Special Education in 1999 at the University of Kansas, where she also worked at the Center for Research on Learning. Her research has focused on effective instruction and instructional technology for adolescents with high incidence disabilities.

Recently, her work is centered on the development and implementation of practice-based approaches to educator preparation with a particular interest in collaborations between university-based preparation programs and PK-12 school environments. She is active in state-level educator preparation work, serving on multiple committees and task forces, and is a founding member of the Michigan Teacher Education Network, an organization dedicated to disrupting patterns of inequity in teaching and teacher education.
