Informational Interviewing Assignment

Objective

Using provided resources as a guide, students will identify a professional in a career field of interest and conduct a 30-45 minute informational interview.

Learning Goals

- 1. Identify experiences available to explore interests and skills (job shadowing, student organizations, volunteer work, introductory classes, etc.)
- 2. Identify potential academic majors and career paths that align with their values, interests, skills, and goals
- 3. Outline a path to reach their early career goals
- 4. Reflect on how their career plans have changed as a result of their exploration activities

Assignment

- 1. Identify a professional in a career field of interest (use personal networks, Central Connections, CMU alumni finder tool on LinkedIn, or other means)
- 2. Develop a series of 8-12 questions to ask that individual in order to gain insight into the career field
- 3. Submit the name/title/organization of interviewee and list of questions to instructor for approval
- 4. Schedule and conduct an in-person or virtual informational interview
- 5. Using the prompts below, compose a two-page essay discussing the insights gained from the interview and the process of scheduling and conducting the interview

Essay Prompts

- 1. How did it feel to contact and interview a professional in your field of interest?
- 2. Based on your conversation, what educational credentials (courses, degrees, certifications) are typically required for entry into this career field? Does this educational path correspond with your current plan of study?
- 3. What internship or volunteer experiences does this person recommend for preparing for this career field? How might you obtain that experience during your undergraduate work?
- 4. What aspects of this profession match your interests, skills, and values? What aspects do not match your preferences?
- 5. If you are still interested in this career field, what will you do next to further your exploration/preparation for it?
- 6. If you are no longer interested in this career field as a result of your informational interview, what will you do next to continue your career exploration?
