Be sure to select the **most recent Undergraduate Bulletin Year**, then select Majors, Minors, Certificates, and Pre-Professional Studies and find your program.
2. Students must earn a minimum of 120 college credits (transfer & CMU), and a minimum of 30 CMU credit hours to earn a bachelor's degree. A grade of C- or better is required for a courses to transfer. A grade C or higher is required for general education competencies and University Program courses. **Under this Teach Out agreement, CMU will waive the 60-credit and 36 credits at the 300-level graduation rules.**
3. Students are required to meet CMU Competency Requirements prior to reaching 56 credit hours or they must enroll in remaining competencies in their first semester(s) at CMU if they have earned over 56 credits. Competencies consist of: two Written English (composition) courses, one Oral English (communication) course, and one Mathematics Competency course. Competencies must be completed with a grade of "C" or above. The University Program general education requirements (27 hours) are required for students taking courses (typically nine) from different designators in the humanities, natural sciences, social sciences, and diversity credits. University Program (UP) courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or above. Additional degree program requirements may be required prior to graduation – see CMU advisor.
4. 12 Writing Intensive (WI) credits are required at CMU. Transfer students may potentially qualify for **Transfer Block** that may waive 6 WI credits.
