The psychology major is very flexible and is appropriate for anyone interested in psychology, regardless of post-graduation plans including graduate school (connect with the Central Michigan University Psychology department for graduate program advising). The major requires that you complete a minimum of 30 credit hours of PSY courses, and at least 18 credits of PSY courses at CMU depending on the concentration.

Important Notes

It is strongly recommended that transfer students contact CMU early in their college career to ensure proper course sequencing for their major, optimizing course scheduling, and timely degree completion at CMU. CMU advising can be reached at 989-774-7506.

You must complete a minimum of 18 hours of psychology course work at CMU.

You must earn a grade of C or better in PSY 211QR and PSY 285 to graduate with the major.

You must earn a grade of "C" or better in PSY 211QR to enroll in PSY 285 and earn a "C" or better in PSY 285 and have completed ENG 201 to enroll in PSY

385. Online courses in PSY 385 are reserved for CMU Online students only. Consult individual course descriptions for prerequisites for other courses. Note: PSY 285 and 385 are offered as WI sections.

Credit restrictions: Only PSY 100 may be taken on a CR/NC basis. No more than 9 hours may be counted from the following courses with unspecified content: PSY 200, PSY 400, PSY 496, PSY 497, PSY 498, PSY 500, PSY 501, PSY 502. Further, not more than 3 hours may be counted from any one unspecified content course.

The **Bachelor of Science** requires completion of a minimum of 9 credit hours of natural or social science at the 300-level or above, at least 6 credits from the same designator and no double counting with General Education. Minors are optional.

Please note that this transfer guide is applicable to those transfer students who will be attending CMU Online.

General Notes

- **Students – Bring a copy of this Transfer Guide with you when meeting with CMU Academic Advisor.**
- A grade of C- or better is required for a course to transfer. Competency courses require a C or better to transfer.
- A bachelor's degree requires a minimum of 120 semester hours of credit. A minimum of 30 semester hours of credit must be earned from CMU.
- This agreement waives the 36 and 60-hour requirements for graduation at CMU for five years, expires June 1, 2029. This 3+1 agreement is for students admitted to CMU Online with a major in Psychology.
- The University Program Requirements and competencies may be fulfilled by students who satisfy the MTA Agreement and/or Associate in Arts degree.
- **Students are required to meet CMU Competency Requirements prior to reaching 56 credit hours. Competency requirements consist of: two Written English (composition) courses, one Oral English (communication) course, and one Mathematics course be completed, each with a grade of "C" or above.**

Any remaining required and elective courses for a bachelor's degree will be selected in consultation with an academic advisor to ensure that CMU degree requirements are being met.
