The psychology major is very flexible and is appropriate for anyone interested in psychology, regardless of post-graduation plans including graduate school. The major requires that you complete a minimum of 30 to 36 credit hours of PSY courses, and at least 18 credits of PSY courses at CMU depending on the concentration.

Important Notes

It is strongly recommended that transfer students contact CMU early in their college career to ensure proper course sequencing for their major, optimizing course scheduling, and timely degree completion at CMU. CMU advising can be reached at 989-774-7506.

You must complete a minimum of 18 hours of psychology course work at CMU.

You must earn a grade of C or better in PSY 211QR and PSY 285 to graduate with the major.

You must earn a grade of "C" or better in PSY 211QR to enroll in PSY 285 and earn a "C" or better in PSY 285 and have completed ENG 201 to enroll in PSY 385. Online courses in PSY 385 are reserved for CMU Online students only. Consult individual course descriptions for prerequisites for other courses. Note: PSY 285 and 385 are offered as WI sections and a grade of "C" or better is needed for the WI requirement. Also, for the Business Psychology and Mental Health Psychology concentrations, you must earn a grade of "C" or higher in all courses except for PSY 100 to count toward these concentrations. Credit restrictions: Only PSY 100 may be taken on a CR/NC basis. No more than 9 hours may be counted from the following courses with unspecified content: PSY 200, PSY 400, PSY 496, PSY 497, PSY 498, PSY 500, PSY 501, and PSY 502. Further, not more than 3 hours may be counted from any one unspecified content course.

NOTE: After adding the possible transfer credits and the credits taken at CMU together, some students will need additional credits to satisfy the **minimum number of 120 credits to graduate, the 60 credits required from a 4 year institution, and the 40 credits required at the 300 level.**

***Students interested in pursuing Board Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst (BCaBA) certification can complete the required**

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (B.S.): Requires completion of a minimum of 9 credit hours of natural or social science at the 300-level or above, at least 6 credit hours from the same designator and no double counting with General Education. Minors are optional

BACHELOR OF ARTS (B.A.): Requires completion of the 202 course or higher in any world language, including American Sign Language (ASL). This requirement may also be satisfied by passing the 202 examination or equivalent. Courses used to fulfill this requirement may be double counted with the University Program Group IV-B.

Please note that this transfer guide is applicable to those transfer students who will be attending CMU's main campus in Mt. Pleasant as well as CMU Online.

General Notes

- A grade of **C-** or better is required for a course to transfer. Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) courses must have a **C** or higher.
- **A bachelor's degree requires a minimum of 120 semester hours of credit. Students will need to complete a minimum of 60 semester hours from an accredited 4-year-degree granting institution. A minimum of 40 hours must be completed at the 300 level or above. A minimum of 30 semester hours of credit must be earned from CMU.**
- The University Program Requirements and competencies may be fulfilled by students who satisfy the MTA Agreement
- **Students are required to meet CMU Competency Requirements prior to reaching 56 credit hours. Competency requirements consist of two Written English (composition) courses, one Oral English (communication) course, and one Mathematics course be completed, each with a grade of "C" or above.**

Any remaining required and elective courses for a bachelor's degree will be selected in consultation with an academic advisor to ensure that CMU degree requirements are being met.
