## Graduation requirements:

- A minimum of 60 semester hours from an accredited 4-year-degree granting institution.
- A minimum of 30 semester hours of credit must be earned from CMU.
- A minimum of 40 hours must be completed at the 300 level or above.
- A minimum of 120 credit hours.
- 6 credit hours must be "WI" Writing Intensive
- 3 credit hours must be "QR" Quantitative Reasoning

•Any remaining required and elective courses for a bachelor's degree will be selected in consultation with an academic advisor to ensure that CMU degree requirements are being met.

•A grade of C- or better is required for a course to transfer.

The University Program Requirements and competencies, other than Writing Intensive competencies, may be fulfilled
by students who satisfy the MTA (Michigan Transfer Agreement).

•Students are required to meet the following CMU Competency Requirements with a "C" or above prior to reaching 56 credit hours: two Written English (composition) courses, one Oral English (communication) course, and one Mathematics.

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
