Graduation requirements:

- ✓ A minimum of 60 semester hours from an accredited 4-year-degree granting institution.
- ✓ A minimum of 30 semester hours of credit must be earned from CMU.
- ✓ A minimum of 40 hours must be completed at the 300 level or above.
- ✓ A minimum of 120 credit hours.
- ✓ 6 credit hours must be "WI" Writing Intensive
- ✓ 3 credit hours must be "QR" Quantitative Reasoning

●Any remaining required and elective courses for a bachelor's degree will be selected in consultation with an academic advisor to ensure that CMU degree requirements are being met.

●A grade of C- or better is required for a course to transfer.

●The University Program Requirements and competencies, other than Writing Intensive competencies, may be fulfilled by students who satisfy the MTA (Michigan Transfer Agreement).

●Students are required to meet the following CMU Competency Requirements with a "C" or above prior to reaching 56 credit hours: two Written English (composition) courses, one Oral English (communication) course, and one Mathematics.
