 - A minimum of 40 hours must be completed at the 300 level or above.

 - 6 credit hours must be "WI" Writing Intensive
 - 3 credit hours must be "QR" Quantitative Reasoning

 - Students are required to meet the following CMU Competency Requirements with a "C" or above prior to reaching 56 credit hours: two Written English (composition) courses, one Oral English (communication) course, and one Mathematics.
