^To take CSD 331, students must have earned at least 24 credit hours. Additionally, it is recommended that students complete their math competency before taking this course.

*These five pre-admission courses can be taken in a number of different ways. For students coming in with no or few credits, most students complete these courses over three to five semesters (two different options for these students are shown above). For students coming in with a lot of credit hours, these courses can be completed over one to three semesters. **When making this decision, students should meet with an advisor before scheduling classes to determine which option is best for them.** Grades in these pre-admission courses will determine who is accepted into the major. Whenever possible, it is recommended that students avoid taking CSD 331 and CSD 335 in the same semester, as these tend to be the two most difficult pre-admission courses.
