Major specific details

- Up to 6 credits may be taken as CR/NC and counted toward the major.

Economics Course Offerings:

- ECO, 222, 281, 301, 306, and 365 are typically offered fall and spring.
- ECO 211, 350, 360 are typically fall only.
- ECO 310, 315, 370, 372 are typically spring only.

Graduation Requirements

- 120-124 credits—based on bulletin year
- 40 credits at the 300 level or above
- Minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA
- 30 credits minimum completed from CMU
- 60 academic credits from an accredited 4-yr institution
- Only 6 credits from PED & RLA count towards graduation

Apply for graduation online at **Degree Progress** two semesters before you plan to graduate using the graduation tab.

Apply by: Oct. 1 for May grad.,
Feb. 1 for Aug. grad., and Apr. 1 for Dec. grad.
