Prerequisites

- ECO 201/ECO 202 are prerequisites for most ECO courses.
- Most BLR courses require BLR 202 or BLR 235 as a prerequisite.
- It is preferred that ECO 365 and BLR 302 be completed before BLR 350/ECO 350.

Major specific details

- Up to 6 credits may be taken as CR/NC and counted toward the major.
- BLR 310 is typically fall only.
- BLR 410 is typically spring only.

2019-20 Bachelor of Science Degree Requirements:

Natural and Social Sciences Requirements (0-13 hours)

- A minimum of 9 credits of natural or social science (see list of designators in the bulletin) at the 300-level or above are required; at least 6 credits from the same designator and no double counting with General Education.
- A minimum of 3-4 credits of statistics or calculus are required from the following: BIO 500, ECO 285, GEL 420, HSC 544, MTH 132, MTH 217, PSY 211QR, SOC 200, STA 282QR, STA 382QR, STA 392 (these may double count with General Education)

Graduation Requirements

- 120-124 credits—based on bulletin year
- 40 credits at the 300 level or above
- Minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA
- 30 credits minimum completed from CMU
- 60 academic credits from an accredited 4-yr institution
- Only 6 credits from PED & RLA count towards graduation

Apply for graduation online at **Degree Progress** two semesters before you plan to graduate using the graduation tab.

Apply by: Oct. 1 for May grad.,
Feb. 1 for Aug. grad., and Apr. 1 for Dec. grad.

Degree Progress
