## **CARE Report**



When you have a concern for a student's health or well being, you can submit a CARE Report online at www.cmich.edu/cmucares. All members of the CARE Team will review submitted concerns. Response plans are identified utilizing the varied experience and knowledge of CARE Team members. If your concern involves an immediate safety risk to self or others, please stop and call 911 or contact CMU Police at 989-774-3081. Otherwise, you can submit a CARE report which is reviewed Monday thru Friday, 8-4:30pm when CMU is open.

## **CARE Team**



The CARE Team is a small group of CMU staff and faculty pooling knowledge and expertise in an effort to support students who may be in distress. Currently, team members represent the following offices: Student Disability Services, Counseling Center, Office of Student Success, Office of Student Conduct, CMU Police, Sexual Aggression Services, Veterans Resource Center, Athletics, Office of Residence Life and the Office of Student Affairs. This team meets weekly during the academic year. The information shared within this group is confidential and used for the purpose of determining the best approach to reach out to the student in distress. The CARE team will engage those resources appropriate and necessary given the circumstances of the concern. Confidential Counseling Center information is NOT shared in these meetings.

The CARE Team respects a student's decision to not engage assistance or support unless information supports imminent risk, or the student's behavior significantly disrupts the living and/or learning environment of others.
