


# Stan Memorial Travel Grant

Applications are welcome for the Clarke Library's International Children's Literature Research grant. The grant will fund travel to Central Michigan University's Clarke Historical Library to conduct research using the International resources found in the Clarke Library's Lucile Clarke Memorial Children's Library. Among these resources are an extensive collection of Hans Christian Andersen Award nominee books and author dossiers.
