6	Completion of an Honors Capstone Project Proposal <i>The Capstone Project involves research or a creative endeavor conducted with a faculty advisor from the student's major or minor discipline. Students are encouraged to begin planning for the Capstone Project during their third year of study at CMU. Proposals must be approved by the Capstone Project advisor and the Honors Program Director. The Capstone Project Proposal is due on or before the last day of class of the Spring semester of the student's third year.</i>			
6	Completion of an Honors Capstone Project and simultaneously enroll in HON499 (3-6 credits)* <i>The completed capstone project is due on or before the last day of class of the fall semester of the student's fourth year. Students are required to present work from their project in a public venue which may include professional conferences, public exhibitions, or the CMU Student Research and Creative Endeavors Exhibition.
