



Centralis Scholarship Competition Application Cover Sheet

To be eligible to compete in the Centralis Scholarship Competition for Fall 2019 admission, I understand the following criteria must be met BEFORE I can register for the competition:

- ✓ I must currently have both a minimum 3.7 high school GPA and 1260 SAT score (or 27 ACT score).
- ✓ If I do not yet meet both of these minimum criteria, I understand that I cannot yet register for the competition.
- ✓ I understand that if I am waiting for either new grades or new standardized test score results to bring me up to the minimum criteria that I cannot register for the competition until I do meet both criteria.
- ✓ I further understand that if I register for the competition without meeting this minimum criteria, that I am ineligible to compete, and that my materials will not be reviewed.

STOP! DO NOT register for the Centralis Competition or submit this application unless you currently meet the minimum competition criteria listed above.

Once you do meet both criteria, you can proceed to register for the competition (steps 1-3).

1. **I must apply for admission to CMU (apply.cmich.edu)** A completed CMU undergraduate admissions application, including official high school transcripts, ACT/SAT score, and the \$35 application fee, should be submitted no later than one month before the competition date.
2. **I must register for the Centralis Competition online at cmich.edu/centralis at least one week prior to my desired competition date.** *I understand in order to register, I must currently have both a minimum 3.7 high school GPA and 1260 SAT score (or 27 ACT score). If I do not yet meet both of these minimum criteria, I understand that I cannot yet register for the competition. I understand that if I am waiting for either new grades or new standardized test results to bring me up to the minimum criteria that I cannot register for the competition until I do meet both criteria. I further understand that if I register for the competition without meeting this minimum criteria, that I am ineligible to compete, and that my materials will not be reviewed.*
3. **I must download the Centralis application (cmich.edu/centralis)** anytime after July 13, 2018, complete it in its entirety, and submit the completed application at the Centralis Competition event.

The paper must be your own work and be no longer than one page. Be sure your name is clearly visible at the top of the page.

III. Creative Piece

On an 8.5 x 11 sheet of paper, (one side only) make a creative presentation that describes who you are and what you bring to the Honors community that distinguishes you from other candidates. Any medium or format is acceptable as long as it fits on the page and is no more than ¼" thick. There are no set guidelines for this part of the application. We want you to use this as an opportunity to express yourself in a creative fashion and we don't want to limit that creativity. Be sure your name is clearly visible on your creative piece.

Both the written personal statement and the creative piece must be securely attached to your application to receive full consideration in the review process.

IV. Centralis Scholarship Applicant Credentials Form (located at bottom of the application). Applicant must fill out the applicant credentials form and attach it to the back page of this scholarship application. The Applicant Credentials Form and the completed Centralis Scholarship Application must be submitted together at the Competition Day.

V. Competition Essay (this part of the application is completed at the Competition Day)

You will receive the prompt for the essay at the Competition and have one hour to respond on-site to the prompt. Your Competition Essay will be later accessed and reviewed for quality of writing as well as evidence of critical thought.

After you have completed this application, we recommend that you review it with a school administrator or counselor. **We also suggest that you make photocopies of the entire application for your records as we will not return these items to you or be able to provide copies for you at a later date.**
