Programs for Family Studies Majors

Denmark-Danish Institute for Study Abroad (DIS) (Tuition Exchange)

Accommodation: Apartment, Homestay or Residence Hall

Language of Instruction: English

Program Duration: Summer or Semester

Good to know: The Danish Institute for Study Abroad (DIS) is an internationally renowned study abroad organization affiliated with the University of Copenhagen. The DIS campus includes a library, student lounges, computer labs, student advising and information services, architecture studios, and classrooms.

England - Edge Hill University (Affiliated)

Accommodation: Residence Halls

Language of instruction: English

Program duration: semester or academic year

Good to know: The picturesque setting in the northwest of England is removed from urban noise and distractions, yet is only a short distance from seaside towns or the city lights of Liverpool and Manchester.

Italy - University of Modena and Reggio Emilia (Affiliated)

Accommodation: Residence Halls

Language of instruction: English

Program duration: summer or semester

Good to know: USAC classes are held at the Reggio Emilia campus of the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia

(UNIMORE), which is one of the oldest universities in Italy



Types of Study Abroad Programs

Tuition Exchange

Exchange programs allow students to pay CMU tuition and fees and enroll directly in a partner university abroad. In exchange, CMU hosts the same number of students from our partner universities.

Affiliated Exchange

Enroll through one of our approved affiliates. Some programs are integrated with local students, others are exclusively for international students. Some programs include on-site support services.

Faculty-Led Programs

Study abroad with other CMU students in courses taught by CMU faculty. Most programs run during spring break or summer. CMU tuition and program fees apply.

Internship Opportunities

All internships are credit-bearing and students will work with a study abroad advisor and a faculty advisor to ensure approval. CMU only offers internships through our partner organizations.
